Presentation Done By Damon Ritzko






Some Things That Students Like About the ALC:




Some Things That Students Dislike About the ALC:




Did students Feel like They Could've Succeeded at Their Old School?:



Why Students Felt Like They Couldn't Succeed at Their Previous School:




Why Students Came To the ALC in the First Place:






What Students Thought Would be Good Improvements to the ALC:
