#### In Praise of Coaches

As the fall season comes to a close, we are proud of all of our teams and athletes, their hard work and their success in competition. Many of us enjoy watching the games and contests. We are excited when teams — Volleyball, Men's Soccer, Cross-Country and Football this fall — excel and enter the playoffs.

For every team, there are volunteer or barely paid coaches giving their all for kids. We had 20 coaches for fall sports. Every one worked daily with student athletes after their "regular jobs". While their co-workers were heading home, our coaches came to their second job on the field or court, giving of their skills, their wisdom and their hearts, inspiring our athletes to push harder, dream bigger, commit more.

As a coach's wife, I remember the many nights Scott was gone from 7:00 in the morning until returning home from Klamath Falls or Lakeview after midnight, then up again to work the next morning. Adding up all the practices, games and planning, Scott invested over 500 hours into a team during the season. Once I foolishly calculated his hourly wage as a paid coach. Not something I advise any of our current coaches to do.

There aren't many jobs more subject to scrutiny than the very public performance of a coach. We can second-guess every decision, every play. Though many of our coaches freely volunteer their time, they may still deal with relentless criticism. No coach is perfect but they are more likely than most of us to research and study the latest innovations in their field.

#### Money, Money, Money!

Worried about paying for college? Here are 4 things you can do NOW!

- 1. Visit <a href="http://www.fafsa.ed.gov/">http://www.fafsa.ed.gov/</a>. This is the official Financial Aid site with information about how it works and the application is online. <a href="Every senior family should complete a FAFSA by January 31st!">Every senior family should complete a FAFSA by January 31st!</a>
- Borrow or buy college guidebooks like the Peterson's College Guides or the Fiske Guide to Colleges. They include information about each college's costs, financial aid resources and (in the Fiske Guide) what percentage of NEED each school will meet.
- Understand the formula: NEED = COST—EFC where EFC means Estimated Family
  Contribution, COST depends on each college but includes living expenses and NEED means the
  amount of financial aid the family qualifies for.
- 4. Practice your essay writing skills! Most scholarship money is decided based on a combination of student resumes and application essays. Be a GREAT essay writer.

#### College Visitations

We strongly encourage families to take their high school age students to college campuses for tours. This is one of the best ways for students to begin imagining themselves as college students and to begin to compare college campuses.

We're so committed to this that we offer every student a school-related absence day to visit a college campus with a parent or guardian. All that's required is a note in advance to the school and, when s/he returns to school, a business card from the Admissions Office. We will offer one school-related absence for this purpose per year. Additional visits will be Verified absences.



#### **SAT Testing Coming Up!**

The SAT test is given 6 times per year. Registration is online at <a href="http://www.collegeboard.com/">http://www.collegeboard.com/</a>. Register by November 5th for the December 6th test or by November 18th with late fee. Cost is \$45 for the basic test if registration completed on time. Students must bring picture ID to the test.

# Sophomores - 2011

#### **OAKS Testing Begins Soon**

Every year, Sophomores are given four statewide assessments in Reading, Mathematics, Science and Writing. The first three are online multiple-choice tests; the writing test is a writing prompt and student-generated work. It is important that students do their best on all of the tests. There are 3 opportunities to meet or exceed the state standards in Reading, Math and Science but only one in Writing. Most testing will be done in the Winter and Spring and students will receive immediate feedback on the online tests.

Schools are evaluated based on the percentage of sophomores who meet or exceed the rigorous state standards. The Class of 2011 will be challenged to beat what the Class of 2010 achieved last year:

#### What are the benefits for students?

- Clear evidence of academic excellence; often cited on college, job and scholarship applications.
- Graduation honors for meeting the CIM include Honors Diploma (other areas of eligibility also) and the CIM tassle to wear proudly on graduation night.
- Cookie/ice cream cards for each OAKS test met or exceeded on the spot.
- Whole sophomore class party for each target met.
- Pride in excelling in competition with other high schools!

#### What else is required to earn a CIM (Certificate of Initial Mastery)?\*

- 3 Speaking Work Samples scored 4s or above
- 3 Writing Work Samples scored 4s or above
- 2 Science Work Samples scored 4s or above
- 2 Mathematics Work Samples scored 4s or above

<sup>\*</sup> While the state of Oregon no longer requires a CIM, Three Rivers School District continues to award the honor to those students who earn one. For the Class of 2012 and after, the CIM or its equivalent will become a graduation requirement.

# #OREGON DIPLOMA Moving Education Forward

#### Our new diploma standards meet changing needs

The staff of North Valley High School has been very busy helping your child prepare for a future most of us can't even imagine today.

It's no surprise the world is changing fast – which brings us to new high school diploma requirements beginning with the class of 2010. The challenges we face are fundamentally different than ever before, due to advances in technology, changes in society, the economy, the environment, and our "shrinking world." Research tells us schools must change to give students new knowledge and skills to succeed in college, at work, and as a citizen. We agree.

In fact, we've known this all along – and *have* been changing. But now it's time bring you in on very specific changes to graduation requirements developed by the Oregon Department of Education in partnership with many educators and stakeholders over the last three years.

At NVHS, we've been involved in school reform and school improvement efforts – such as the conversion to Trimester, increased Advanced Placement opportunities and our new Gear Up Initiative. That's why we are embracing the spirit of Oregon's more rigorous diploma.

How is the diploma changing? One major change is that state credit requirements for graduation are increasing as are Three Rivers School District's, with an increased emphasis in math and science. In a nutshell, students need to accomplish three things to earn a diploma:

- 1) Successfully complete credit requirements;
- 2) Demonstrate proficiency in essential skills;
- 3) Meet personalized learning requirements.

First things first: This issue of the Knightline News details credits requirements. Each month we'll include more about how we're implementing new diploma requirements.

- Class of 2009 needs the following credits: English/Language Arts 4; Math 2; Science 2; Social Sciences 3; PE and health, each 1; Second Language, the Arts, Career and Tech Ed (CTE) 1; electives 12, for a total of 25.
- Class of 2010 and 2011: English/Language arts 4; Math 3; Science 2; Social Sciences 3; PE and Health, each 1; Second Language, Arts, CTE 1; Careers .5 and electives 11.5 for a total of 26 (2010) or 26.5 (2011).
- Class of 2012 and 2013: English/Language Arts 4; Math 3; Science 3, Scientific inquiry (2 with lab experiences); Social Sciences 3; PE and Health, each 1; Second Language, Arts, CTE 3; Careers .5 and electives 8.5 for a total of 27. Beginning with the Class of 2012, graduates will also have to demonstrate the essential skills of Reading, Writing, Speaking, Math and Science.


