1) Ashley Rhodebeck, Kane County Chronicle, requested the following records: "The information the district will submit this year for the ISBE annual student suspension report for the 2010/11 school year; The number of out of school suspensions and in school suspensions for 2010/11 if those aren't broken down in the information submitted to ISBE; The number of disciplinary hearings heard by the school board; The number of after-school detentions or weekend detentions; The number of expulsions; Please send this information from the years 2008/09, 2009/10 and 2010/11. If possible, please break down the data by school."

This FOIA was received August 17, 2011, and responded to on August 24, 2011. It took five District employees a total of seven hours (\$233.44) to respond to this FOIA.

2) Kerry Lester, Daily Herald, requested the following records: "A list of any and all reciprocal reporting agreements in place with local police departments, and the date upon when each agreement was effective; The total number of times that reciprocal reporting was used in the 2010-11 school year; The total number of district students that were arrested in the 2010-11 school year."

This FOIA was received August 29, 2011, and responded to on August 31, 2011. It took 10 District employees a total of 6 hours, 50 minutes (\$253.33) to respond to this FOIA.

3) Heidi Roed, 515 Peyton Street, Geneva, requested the following records: "1) What is the total cost to the Geneva school district for the 'Geneva School News'? 2) I received it in my mailbox. Is it also distributed via email?"

This FOIA was received September 6, 2011, and responded to on September 8, 2011. It took one District employee a total of 30 minutes (\$14.38) to respond to this FOIA.

4) Ashley Rhodebeck, Kane County Chronicle, requested the following records as a follow-up to her August 17, 2011 FOIA request: "The breakdown of the number of in-school and out-of-school suspensions districtwide."

This FOIA was received September 2, 2011, and responded to on September 7, 2011. It took two District employees a total of 45 minutes (\$23.95) to respond to this FOIA.
