Kindergarten

Kindergarten is learning about coins and graphing data. In reading, we'll be writing procedural texts which will lead to some fun how-to activities. We will continue to grow as readers and writers and also, push ourselves towards 100 sight words.

First Grade

While the year is coming to an end, in 1st grade the learning is continuing full steam ahead. In math our kids will learn how to measure with non-standard units. They will also learn the importance of charitable giving and saving money. In ELAR, the kids are going to learn about media literacy. We are also going to review fiction and nonfiction stories and the author's purpose for writing them. We will also have a great time creating our own fictional stories. In social studies, we will learn the difference between a good and a service. Finally, in science, the kids are going to learn about different environments.

Second Grade

In 2nd grade math our students will be counting coins and learning about personal financial literacy, such as lending and borrowing. Several classes will create a store in order to give their students multiple opportunities to use money in a real, authentic way. In reading our 2nd graders will continue to do connected genre studies and research projects. Writing lessons will be closely connected to this, and students will review how to write both narrative and expository pieces. In science we are learning about life cycles. Mrs. Green has given our students the opportunity to observe the life cycle of a butterfly by providing a butterfly habitat. Students have watched caterpillars create a chrysalis and are eagerly waiting to see them emerge as butterflies.
