CTE Update – February is National Career and Technical Education Month

- Health Science Practicum Students-Orientation and Clinical Rotations On Friday, January 24th Health Science Technology Practicum students and instructors Jennifer Pike and Michaela Skinner attended clinical orientation at Christus Good Shepherd in Longview. These students will be job shadowing in different clinical departments within the hospital beginning the week of February 3rd -7th.
 - In addition to job shadowing, these students are currently taking dual credit classes in conjunction with Kilgore College and will have the ability of becoming a certified Patient Care Technician before graduation from high school.
 - Students will shadow with the following healthcare specialists or work in these departments: Dialysis, EKG Technician, Registered Nurses, Nurses' Aides, Patient Care Technicians, Phlebotomy and surgical technicians.
- Clinical Affiliation for Exercise Science and Wellness Pending Position and Agreement
 - Met with Christus Good Shepherd to explore possible options for students who are enrolled in Practicum of Exercise Science and Wellness courses to participate in clinical rotations.
 - CTE Director and Athletic Director will be requesting opportunities to partner together to share a teacher/trainer.
 - The teacher will provide classroom instruction in Kinesiology and Practicum (1/2 time teacher) and the trainer will work in athletes (1/2 trainer). Salary would be split between the two departments, if position and assignments are approved.

- The day kicked off with a keynote presentation from Gaylen Lyons and Jacob Bradburry, Chick-a-Fila management personnel. Their presentation focused on the importance of employability skills and how these skills relate to career success. Keynote presenters provided students with tips on how to apply for a job, how to fill out a job application and interview skills. The presentation ended with a discussion relating to specific skills needed to be successful in the world of work.

The presenters covered topics such as: education and training needed for the job, skills needed to be successful on the job, salary ranges, advancement opportunities as well as overview of what the future job outlook might look like.
