BTIM - Beginning Teacher Induction and Mentoring (Cycle 4)

Michelle King is writing a TEA Grant that would provide \$75,000 to focus on professional development for beginning educators and their mentors. The grant is due March 9, 2010.

Description of Program (from TEA announcement)The purpose of the Beginning Teacher Induction and Mentoring (BTIM) program is to establish or enhance a beginning teacher induction and mentoring program designed to increase retention of beginning teachers. Texas Education Code §21.458 states that public school districts and open enrollment charter schools may assign a qualified mentor teacher to each classroom teacher who has less than two years of teaching experience in a subject area or grade level.

Grant funds can be used by eligible school districts or open-enrollment charter schools for:

- mentor stipends,
- mentor training, and
- mentor release time to meet/observe the beginning teachers

To the extent practicable, a teacher mentor must:

- (1) teach in the same school;
- (2) teach the same subject or grade level as applicable; and
- (3) meet qualifications as determined by the commissioner.

Requirements for teacher mentors are:

- (1) have at least three complete years of teaching experience and a superior history of improving student performance.
- (2) have completed of a research-based mentor and induction training program approved by the commissioner;
- (3) have completed of a mentor training program provided by the district

Master Mentor (Grant Funded)

hire up to 1.5 Master Mentors to work with beginning teachers (0-1 year) in Math, Science, ELAR, and Social Studies

must be eligible to work during school hours (retired/non-working veteran teacher are eligible)

interviewed and selected by grant committee

mentor must have certification and/or specialized training in mentee's instructional area

must attend required training (3-5 days in summer; plus at least 5 after school sessions during academic year)

meet with mentee at least once every 2 weeks and complete observation/coaching sessions

complete required mentor/mentee documentation

Campus Buddy Mentor (Local Funds)

Principals' select from current staff based on district-developed criteria

stipend - \$500

for teachers with 2-3 years experience **and** new to CISD

mentor must have certification and/or specialized training in the mentee's instructional area

must attend required training (2 days in summer (grant-funded stipend); plus at least 5 after school sessions during academic year)

meet with mentee at least once every 2 weeks

complete required mentor/mentee documentation

Grant will pay for

- salaries for Master Mentors
- Professional development for Master Mentors and Campus Buddy Mentors
- Stipends for Campus Buddy Mentor to attend required summer training
