Morrow County School District TELL Oregon Survey Results:

The **Teaching, Empowering, Leading and Learning (TELL) Oregon** survey is an anonymous statewide survey. The goal of **TELL Oregon** survey results is to provide educators with data, tools and direct support to facilitate school improvement.

It rolled out as a questionnaire process that Morrow County Educators and Oregon school teachers filled out in early March of the 13-14 school year. The intent of the survey was to assess teaching conditions at the school, district and state level.

In a nut shell: The survey assessed how happy educators were in their work environment.

For an idea of topics addressed in the survey, here are some of the responses by district, broken down by percentage.

On the whole, MCSD educators are fairly satisfied in their work environment as compared to the state: Teachers have more time to collaborate with colleagues, are able to educate with minimal disruptions, and feel students understand expectations for their conduct and follow school rules. In fact, when it came to most categories- MCSD teachers are more satisfied at work than many of their colleagues across the state.
