PARENT TEACHER CONFERENCES



That is similar to the average but not what we would like to see. Increasing that attendance will always be something we will look to do and it will remain one of our goals.

SENIOR PROJECT PRESENTATIONS

The majority of our seniors have now successfully completed their senior projects. The few students who have not attempted a presentation and the few students who did not pass their first try will have the opportunity to complete at the end of April. The final round of presentations this last week was impressive. It is so rewarding to see how mature and thoughtful these students have become over their high school careers.

SAFETY AT IVHS

IVHS staff will be trained by Officer Fields of the JOCO Sheriffs Department on March 6th for Active Shooters on Campus. Mr. Fields will explain the role of the Department and the role of school staff during these occurrences. We will have a follow-up drill in March to practice with Mr. Fields. We are experiencing issues with our fire alarms not being audible in parts of our school. As we do our assessments of child safety, this has been identified by teachers as a major concern. With the help of College Dreams and our SMILE Program, we work hard to get as many kids as possible onto college campuses. Students have visited the University of Oregon, Oregon State, Lane Community College, George Fox, and OIT. We recently had RCC on campus and thev administered placement tests to roughly 50 students. We strongly believe that exposing students to these possibilities will increase the likelihood that they will see postsecondary education as a part of their futures.

BATTLE OF THE BOOKS

A new program at IVHS has been started - THE BATTLE OF THE BOOKS. Students will be invited to start reading from a list of books and compete at the state competition. Megan Brown is coaching the team this year and they have already qualified for the state competition.

COUGAR ATHLETICS

Congratulations to our Wrestling program as they have qualified seven wrestlers for the state tournament in Portland on February 22nd and 23rd. Logan Miller, Brandon Parker, TJ Hughey, Julian Northrup, Eric Miller, John Britt, and Zach Clark all punched their tickets weekend at Regionals at Coquille High School. This past weekend the guys went up to the state meet and competed real hard. The Cougars placed more wrestlers than any other Josephine or Jackson County team at the state tournament and finished higher than anyone else in Southern Oregon, 9th place.
