## Volunteer Appreciation (Findley and Jacob Wismer Elementary Schools) – Bethany Baptist Church

At Findley Elementary School, the church has generated volunteers to participate in organized games during students' recesses. The volunteers will play the games with students and utilize the Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) Grid and Life Skills Tickets to promote positive behavior. Students will learn how to handle winning and losing situations, encourage each other, and deal with conflict and/or controversy during games.

- Role-play scenarios
- PBIS Grid and Life Skills Tickets
- Tour of the Findley playground area, provided by Findley's 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Dragon Riders
- Safety procedures

At Jacob Wismer Elementary School, Bethany Baptist volunteers will participate in a Reading Buddy Program for struggling readers in all grade levels.
