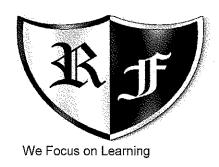

## LITTLE BAY PRIMARY COMPREHENSIVE NEEDS ASSESSMENT DATA SUMMARY 2012 - 2013

Little Bay Primary is one of five campuses in Aransas County Independent School District. Our campus serves predominantly economically disadvantaged families. 80% of the students qualify for free or reduced lunch prices. We have a total of 17 Limited English Proficient PK-K students who are served through our English as a Second Language Program. Our campus serves students ages 3-6 in the Preschool Program for Children with Disabilities (PPCD) which has increased to an enrollment of 21 students.

The data reviewed included the following:

Data analysis from formal and informal student assessments. Formal assessments include the Kindergarten Observation Survey (OS) and the Fountas and Pinnell Benchmark Assessment System. Each six weeks our students are assessed on targeted skills and results are reported to parents through developmental report cards.

Parents will be given information at the beginning of each year that explains the curriculum for their children's grade levels as required by the State of Texas.

Periodic newsletters with event calendar will be sent at least every six weeks.

Assessments will be given throughout the year, and parents will be notified of students' progress. Assessments at the Kindergarten level include the Observation Survey, Fountas and Pinnell Reading Benchmark Assessment, sight word assessments, and Report Card assessment data. Assessments for Pre - Kindergarten are district/teacher made skill-referenced tests, given each six weeks based on curriculum guidelines enumerated by the Texas Education Agency.

Through the "Treasure Reader" program, parents will be given the opportunity to read with their children and be recognized for their participation in this incentive program by the school library staff and "Captain Book."

A School-Home Compact will be implemented each year to outline how schools and parents will share responsibilities for ensuring student achievement.
