The academic progress of your child improves when you show your interest in their performance at school. For the upcoming parent conference day we will be scheduling conferences in the following manner:

Parents are asked to sign up for a block of time during the available 12:00 noon – 4:00 pm conferences. Teachers will be located in their classrooms and you are welcome to visit any or all of your student's teachers. During the 5 pm to 8 pm evening conferences all teachers will be located in the commons. #### 2009/2010 ADVERSE WEATHER CONDITIONS

#### **Straight Line Routes For:**

Hidden Valley, Lincoln Savage, Madrona, Williams, Fruitdale, Jerome Prairie, Applegate

In the event of adverse weather conditions parents are advised to tune in to Radio Stations KRWQ, KAJO, KLDR, KBOY and TV Stations KOBI (5), KDRV (12), KTVL (10) or the 3 Rivers School District Web Page for information on school bus schedules.

Sometimes weather conditions leave some roads blocked or unsafe to travel but school is still being held. Under these circumstances "straight line routes" will be run. This is the information you will get on the web page or radio/TV stations.

When straight line routes are run the roads affected are listed below.

If you live on one of the roads the buses cannot travel, you may bring your student to the nearest intersection of the main road traveled. This will also be the stop for the afternoon drop off.
