Lorna Byrne and a select student group from Fleming participated in the initial pilot this year and while the test did not generate a student score report, the experience gave us valuable insight as to the format and the dramatic increase in rigor associated with the questions presented. Fleming will be participating in the pilot again in the fall on a broader scale so that all staff members will have the opportunity to experience this information. This experience will allow teachers to develop lessons and alter certain practices and questioning strategies in the classroom so that they may better prepare their students and practices for the change in 2014.
