
February Board Report

In Math, the colony schools had an increase in Tier 1 by 3 students and increased Tier 3 by one student from fall to winter.

Strengths:

The stability of having two classroom teachers at Big Sky in comparison to the past two years is evidenced in our winter benchmarking scores. Students have shown consistent improvement from fall to winter especially in the area of mathematics.

Concerns/Needs:

An area of concern for Glendale School is the need of a paraprofessional to support instruction. With a couple of students showing declines in test scores from fall to winter

benchmarking it is evident that an additional support person is needed. Until an applicant applies for the open position we will utilize an iTutor support person to provide Tier II intervention in ELA and math for one student and in ELA for another.
