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

EDUCATION OF ALL DISABLED CHILDREN/YOUNG ADULTS

Public Law 105.17 know n as I.D.E.A. (Individualized Disability Education Act) requires that school districts provide a free and appropriate education to all disabled children/young adults age 0 to 21.
