Key Areas of Focus



Key areas of focus in the 2025–2026 CIPs include:

- 1. Increase the district's accountability rating for Domain I: Student Achievement in reading, math, science, and social studies to ensure all campuses meet acceptable accountability ratings.
- 2. Increase the number of students who show strong academic progress each year, moving from 72% of students growing as expected to 80%.
- 3. Strengthen parent and family engagement opportunities.
- 4. Building campus administration capacity through targeted professional development aligned to campus academic needs.
- 5. Increase the awareness of fiscal stewardship and operational excellence by focusing resources on instructional expenditures to support academic goals.


