Discussion Items

School Improvement Plan - Lisle High School

The Lisle High School Administrative Team shared information regarding academic progress, social-emotional support systems, and their building goals.

- The administrative team discussed the school's progress over the past year and the Top 5 Areas of Focus for the current school year.
- Attendance data shows a clear correlation between attendance and both the average GPA and average ACT score. A higher attendance rate led to higher performance in both areas.
- 2025 Illinois ACT Assessment and preACT results showed a strong performance overall in ERW and math.
- The High School shared that while it earned a Commendable Illinois School Designation, strong growth was made in several of the indicators. As previously reported, corrections to the classification of students transferring out of LHS that impacted the graduation rate were not received in time for the Illinois State Board of Education to recalculate the School Designation for the 2024-2025 School Year.
- Information about updated course sequences in Math and Science was reviewed.
- Information about how the assessment data informs student supports, curricular decisions, and instructional approaches was discussed.
- The evolution of the Illinois ACT was discussed as well as some of the differences between the Illinois ACT and the National ACT.
- The 2025 AP results showed a five-year high in the total number of AP students and total number of exams taken.
- Aspects of the Student Services team information about the student population's needs and supports were discussed.
- Various student experiences and supports have been implemented to further develop a positive school culture and support student social-emotional growth, incorporating student feedback through the Vision 202 student focus groups.
- The administration presented information about the 5Essentials Survey results.
- The administration addressed Board member questions throughout the presentation.

New Club Proposal - Lisle Junior High School Spanish Club

- Dr. Filipiak shared an overview of the 2024–2025 pilot outcomes. When the pilot was originally approved, it was agreed that the club would return to the Board for full approval this year if the pilot proved successful.
- With approximately 35 students participating, interest was strong and the pilot met expectations.
- Based on this, the administration will recommend approval of the proposal at the December Board meeting in accordance with the initial pilot agreement.

• This will be the only new activity moving forward due to the District's current financial position. No additional clubs, activities, or athletics will be added until further notice.
