How are we doing?

AVID

FCS took part in another summer institute in San Diego this August. From our building we were able to bring Robin Van Buren, Sydney Ziehl, Jeremy Brown and Leah Gottheiner. We are are excited to continue implementing school wide AVID strategies in the middle school next year and building our AVID elective. The AVID site team set three goals for next year to build stronger systems for our AVID program and to collect data to analyze how AVID strategies are impacting students in the classroom. Some middle school teachers will also be piloting interactive notebooks in their classrooms, which has shown great results at other AVID schools.

ODE Summer Reading Academy

During the first week of August, a team of FCS teachers attended a reading conference in Eugene. The Department of Education gave FCS an invitation to this presentation. Our goal was to add knowledge to our existing staff and build capacity of reading skills for our new staff. The design of effective reading programs was the emphasis of our training. It is the intention of FCS staff to focus our attention to raising achievement in reading for our upcoming year.

Our K-3 teacher team training was learning how to examine the best methods to support the development of early reading through teaching the foundational reading skills (phonemic awareness, phonics, sight words, spelling & fluency) in an engaging way for all students in the primary classroom. Additionally, the team was able to discuss how and where the foundational skills fit into a comprehensive literacy-block, with opportunities to practice these skills. The teachers were able to learn strategies and receive tools to diagnose what our students deficient skills are in order to intervene to support growth.

The upper grades had training in how our program needs to look with the Common Core shift in standards. The shift requires teachers to emphasize close reading of text to cite contextual evidence. This emphasizes accountable talk when writing to support a view with evidence-based text. When students create and defend an opinion, now students need to cite evidence. Our teams were able to view appropriate types of evidence-based sentence stems to describe

pieces of evidence. In addition, they were able to work on some sample lessons with the reading trainer to build their skills.

Updates on ELA, RTI and Reading Training

This summer the staff has done a lot of work to improve our ELA instruction and we are excited to get back to work to apply our skills. After a year of teaching with our new curriculum we have identified strengths and weaknesses and have done a ton of work to deepen our own understanding of great ELA teaching. Many teachers spent August 1st-3rd at ODE's Summer Academy for Reading. We took away key strategies and background knowledge to help us create an improved, well balanced, and more effective delivery of ELA instruction. The primary teachers focused on solid foundational instruction while the intermediate teachers looked at key strategies to utilize in their teaching to really improve student outcomes.

This upcoming school year we plan on clarifying, solidifying, and expanding our RTI process. We are working closely with ODE, ORTI, and Ed Northwest to ensure our program is well built and does an excellent job of helping kids. We will be utilizing our new resources and our new knowledge base to improve core instruction for all students.
