Subject: Consider and Take Possible Action to Approve the Recommended Realignment of District Attendance Zones for 2026-2027

Date: November 5, 2025

The Board of Trustees adopted the McKinney ISD Strategic Plan on January 22, 2024. Pillar 6, Finance and Facilities, of the Strategic Plan establishes that the District will create an updated master plan to address current and future facility needs. Strategy 6.3 of the Strategic Plan instructs the District to identify and repurpose facilities that are underutilized by creating a Long Range Facilities Planning Committee to plan for the utilization of current and future facilities to maximize their full potential. On September 5, 2024, the MISD Board formed a Long Range Facilities Planning Committee with a charge to recommend long range building and property efficiencies, up to and including; campus programming; feeder pattern options; attendance boundaries; and/or adding/retiring campuses based on current and projected enrollment. The Long Range Facilities Planning Committee recommended the District avoid the operational and staffing costs associated with underutilized campuses by updating attendance zones at all levels and repurposing three elementary campuses for alternative district operational uses.

On September 15, 2025, the MISD Board adopted a resolution forming the Educational Facilities Alignment Committee (EFAC). McKinney ISD has experienced enrollment growth and demographic shifts that require adjustments to attendance zones to ensure equitable distribution of students, optimal utilization of facilities, and alignment with projected capacity needs. The committee has studied data related to projected student enrollment, campus student capacity, and geographic location of planned development in the district. The committee has worked to develop and refine new attendance zones for elementary, middle, and high schools to be implemented for the 2026-2027 school year.

Impact Statement: The Board of Trustees, as good stewards, strategically and equitably manage District resources to meet identified student needs and align resource allocations with District goals.

It is recommended: Approval of the recommendation to realign district attendance zones for 2026-2027.
