Ciao, Italy! Gr. 2-4 **Joannah Ballard:** Let's go on an Italian adventure! We will explore a different Italian city each day of camp—five cities in five days! We will look at great works of art and important architectural structures like the Leaning Tower of Pisa, smell Italian smells like coffee and leather, enjoy tasty Italian foods like pizza and gelato (that's ice cream), and listen to beautiful Italian music. Let's explore Italy together!

Party in the USA! Gr. 2-4, **Sally Amos:** Celebrate the USA! The land of the free and the home of the brave is full of exciting lore and beautiful symbols that show people we are the greatest country in the world! Become the Statue of Liberty and speak for her! Take a virtual tour of the White House. Discover the meaning of the Pledge of Allegiance and why we salute the Star Spangled Banner. Come meet Uncle Sam and enjoy learning about our Fabulous nation!

Lego My Robot, Gr. 4-6, Dana Maharrey: (if a Challenge student at Pierce St., this will be repetitive, as it is taught in 4th grade) Using the familiar toy, LEGOS, students will imagine, design, create and program moving robots! Students will discover how the amazing world of robots surrounds them as they are introduced to basic robotic terms and concepts. This camp exposes eager learners to the endless possibilities that are entangled in the exciting world of robotics!

Movie Magic, Gr. 4-6, Holly Gray at THS Media Center: This camp will teach students how to plan, create and publish videos using both still photography and digital video. We will use Macbooks with the iLife creative suite for the video and editing process. Since this camp will be held at Tupelo High School there will be a wealth of digital cameras and technology available for advanced editing processes.

Purple, Green, Yellow, and Blue, Fun with Paint What Can You Do? Gr. K-2 & 3-6, **Kathy Palmer:** if you love colors, if you want to create, come to this camp to see what you can make! We'll tie-dye and paint, and experiment too! Purple, Green, Yellow, and Blue: Have fun with paint, what can you do!

CSI Tupelo, Gr. 4-6, Sally Amos: Come and join the ranks of the Crime Scene Investigators in Las Vegas, Miami, and New York as we delve into the world of forensic science! Gather and process evidence, become skilled in fingerprint analysis—train with the CSI team to become rookie investigators! All these adventures and more await you during CSI Tupelo!

Journey to the Center of the Earth, Gr. 2-4, Jennifer Rinehart: Discover the earth and all its layers! Through a variety of experiments, and art-based learning, camp participants will journey to the center of the Earth by exploring each layer and how it works! Erupting volcanoes, mountain building, and movement of the continental plates will make this camp a blast!

Maxed Out Fitness, Gr. K-2 & 2-4, Clint Newsom: Do you like to MOVE?? Well, this is the camp for you. We will explore different aspects of general fitness and get our bodies into motion by learning dances to some of your favorite songs, playing some sports you know, and learning some games you may have never heard of. Let's MOVE!!

Spend the week immersed in all things YOU: Things YOU like and don't like to do, write a poem, sing a song, show the world where you belong! Express your creativity and personality, too! Create Bio Bottles, Silhouettes, and much more! Join the fun at this YOUunique camp!

Surf City, Gr. 2-4, Marion Winders: Students will be exposed to a variety of Mac software programs including Photo Booth, iPhoto, Keynote, Garage Band, & Pages. Campers will "surf" the internet and learn how to incorporate images and text into documents. Students will create a "Summer Camp Newsletter" to distribute to all campers! This camp insures a fun, positive, learning experience as we journey through SURF CITY!

Things That Go Bump in the Night, Gr. 2-4, Sherry Willis: Have you ever wondered what happens at night when you are asleep? Come explore the world of night creatures. We will investigate bats, bugs, and birds. We will dissect owl pellets and see a real bat up close. Science experiments, arts and crafts, and many fun activities await you. So put your night goggles on as we uncover the creatures of the night!

Recycle to Sow, Gr. 3-6, Debbie Walls: Come and connect with nature... CREATE, RENEW, REUSE & RECYCLE! Set out on a fun-filled scavenger hunt for items to use during the week. Create a recycling garden, paint with nature, and even create a bird feeder! Make a treasure to take home everyday! Have a blast using the wonder of nature to make the world a better, more beautiful place! Come and see what surprises await you!

On Your Mark, Get Set, Learn... The World of Track and Field, Gr. 4-6 Bo Boatner/Anna Sloan: Campers will be introduced to a variety of track and field events and experience the feeling of participation in these events. Basic tips and techniques will be presented by special guests Campers will compete in a mini decathlon, Running-rich games and team building activities will round out the fun!

Photography, Gr. 3-6, Nancy Barrett: Explore the world of photography by learning the art of taking a good picture. Campers will live through the lens of their camera. Campers will learn the elements of photography and apply their newly learned knowledge by participating in a variety of activities including creating a digital portfolio.
