Legal Requirements: Title IX 34 C.F.R., Section 106.9 and Section 504: 34 C.F.R., Section 104.8 indicates that a recipient must notify students and employees of the name, office address and phone number of the designated employee. In determining whether the recipient complies with the notification requirement, the review team reviewed the materials (i.e. student handbook, catalog, brochures on programs and activities) that were submitted by the recipient. After reviewing the materials that were submitted the recipient did not provide enough evidence to indicate its compliance with the notification requirement for the Title IX and Section 504 Coordinator, for example, publishing this information in brochures on programs and web site.
