1st Grade boys were treated to a short presentation by the local area boys scout council leadership. A brief overview of the scouting program in Pana was presented, and was be followed up by an informational meeting for parents at the Pana Christian Church.

The RtI benchmarking sweep was completed the week of September 6-9. The children were extremely cooperative during the testing period and did an excellent job demonstrating their skill level. The data collected has been used to create individualized programs targeted at addressing the specific skill deficits of our children. Researched based interventions have begun, and another year of learning is under way.

The PREP/EC classroom will also be visiting the Pumpkin Patch on Monday October 17th. Students have been studying about the life cycle of plants, how plants grow. This will be their culminating activity of the unit.

Mrs. Denning, the Parent Program Coordinator, hosted a SMART Buddy luncheon on Friday September 2nd. The SMART Buddy program promotes learning for students by matching them with a big buddy who works with them weekly and helps to celebrate their accomplishments. This worthwhile program has grown every year and continues to provide wonderful learning partners to children.

Students have begun another year of "collection". Students continue to collect soda tabs, plastic lids and box tops for education. We have placed the boxes for soda tabs and box tops in the hallway outside the office. Students at Washington and Lincoln collected 8 boxes of soda tabs last year for Ronald McDonald House Charities in Springfield.

Over the last 2 years, students at Washington and Lincoln School were able to recycle nearly 5,000 pounds of plastic caps and contribute to the purchase of benches for the playground and for the parks revitalization project! That is an amazing accomplishment that was achieved by the teamwork and caring of our
