Over half of the children at Nehalem Elementary School qualify for free or reduced priced meals. Many of these children face hunger over weekends and school breaks. The Nehalem Elementary School Backpack Program is an ongoing volunteer-based organization that provides food for local hungry children at times when other resources are not available, such as weekends and holidays. Volunteers provide the children who are enrolled in the program with a bag of food for the weekend. These food resources will support the health, behavior, and achievement of every student that participates. The success in programs like this can be seen in positive changes in student attendance, behaviors, and grades.

NCRD Youth Center is still operating as an Emergency Child Care. Our hours are 7:30am-5:30pm, Monday- Friday. While your child is with us we will supervise their CDL, provide nutritious morning and afternoon snacks as well as enrichment activities(outdoor play/walks, gym time, crafts, music, science, etc.)- all while following strict health and safety guidelines. The cost is \$15 for a full day or \$10 for a half day.

NCRD/Nehalem Pool is offering a PE/Recreational Swim Skills refresher to NES students (includes homeschoolers) by reservation. We have been providing this swim opportunity to all families who were interested since September 21, 2020. We have some after school options available. If you are interested in signing up your student or gathering more information, please call or e-mail Sue Gray.

- *NCRD/Nehalem Pool is following strict CDC guidelines in a well sanitized facility that complies with Oregon Health Authority Recommendations.
- *No showers before or after swim(dressing room available for dressing and toilets).
- *Students would need to be dropped off and picked up.
- *Specific co-hort groups are established...kids connect with other kids inside stable pods!
- *Each participant fills out a NCRD Patron Agreement & Liability waiver(one time only--stays on file-contact tracing purposes). Waiver's available @ NCRD main office entry and pool entry.....
- *Daily client covid health checklist to be completed upon entry each week.
- *Swim program is offered once a week(as space allows, honoring availability, and social distancing).
- *Swim lessons are <u>FREE</u> of charge to NES students(includes homeschoolers). The minimum safe age to participate will be determined on an individual basis.
