To Whom It May Concern:

We are Jessie and Becky Vickers, parents of Taylor, Hoyt, and Reileigh Vickers, former students of Guy-Perkins School from 2015-2020. Two years ago, we tried to enroll in Quitman Public School through School Choice but were denied by Guy-Perkins; therefore, our children continued one more year at Guy-Perkins for the school year of 2019-2020. Unfortunately, we were still dissatisfied with our experience there, which made homeschool our only alternative for the school year of 2020-2021, regardless of the COVID-19 pandemic.

For the upcoming 2021-2022 school year, we applied again to Quitman through School Choice. We have been approved by Quitman School district and have started the registration process. As you could imagine, we were shocked to receive a letter this late to inform us that Guy-Perkins has, yet again, blocked our choice.

As a family, we had hoped Guy-Perkins would be our school of choice. However, two main factors have contributed to our decision to withdraw: poor education and lack of discipline. All three of our enrolled children have suffered due to these issues. Here are a few specific examples:

Concerning Taylor

- After excelling in kindergarten, Taylor fell behind in her academics. There was no control
 of students in her class, turning her love for school into dread.
- She spent most of her class time assisting special needs classmates, causing her to fall even more behind.
- In second grade, death threat notes were written on desks with glue. She came home
 worried; and when we contacted the school, they refused to communicate with us. It
 was not until we went to the school that they vaguely explained the situation, leaving us
 more concerned.

Regarding Hoyt

- Hoyt also fell behind drastically after kindergarten.
- By second grade we were getting frustrated at home with his lack of ability to read.
 When we asked the teacher about it, the only response we were given was "It's a chatty class." Since we began homeschooling, Hoyt has been diagnosed with severe dyslexia, costing us more than \$2000.00 in tutoring expenses to bring him to grade level.
- The classroom environment was notorious for being uncontrollable.

Lastly Reileigh

- Reileigh is naturally gifted academically. When her teacher felt that grade-level work
 was too easy, administration refused to advance her studies saying, "It would make her
 lazy."
- There has been a child in her class, on several occasions, that has tried to undress the girls with little to no consequences or changes made.

We feel that Quitman would be a better placement for our children. Quitman ranks first in Cleburne County as well as 13th of 294 schools by the US News. Also, Quitman is the first Model PLC school by Solutions Tree in the state of Arkansas. They have a dyslexia specialist on staff as well as a full-time school resource officer for safety. We have spent time meeting school administration, talking to other parents associated with Quitman School. We believe that because of the strong academic program, the priority of children, and the overall wholesomeness of Quitman School, this is where our children belong.

We understand by Ark. Code Ann. §6-18-1906 that Guy-Perkins can oppose our choice due to a transfer maximum being met. However, if denied leave to Quitman School, we will be forced to continue homeschooling, which negates Guy-Perkins' bind on us to the district. We are asking the State Board of Education to consider this matter and open the door of opportunities for our children in our preferred school.

My name is Dr. Joe Fisher and I have been the Superintendent of Guy-Perkins Schools since July 2020. The Guy-Perkins Elementary School has worked diligently over the past two (2) year to identify areas for improvement by setting goals and tracking performance data to help increase student achievement and create a more safe and successful learning environment. This is evidenced by the following:

- The Faulkner County Sheriff's Office assigned Deputy Stephen Ferguson as a full-time School Resource Officer for the Guy-Perkins and Mt. Vernon-Enola School Districts in 2020-21. Deputy Ferguson works daily to help educate our students, faculty, and parents/families on the issues of making good choices in society and provides safety and protection during a crisis. As a result, our student discipline rate has decreased in 2021-22 and parents have expressed a better sense of safety and security within the district.
- Guy-Perkins Elementary School was selected by DESE to participate in the application process for becoming a designated "Schools of Innovation" in Arkansas. During this past year of application and program development, teachers and administrators have worked to create specialized learning pathways for each of our students in grades K-6. Guy-Perkins Elementary School anticipates being designated as a "School of Innovation" in Arkansas by the end of the 2021-22 school year.
- Guy-Perkins Elementary School was recently selected by DESE to participate in the PLC Regional Project from 2021-2024. This work is similar to the process that Quitman worked through in Cohort 2, but will require less oversight from DESE/Solution Tree due to the district's capacity to continue its current PLC work. Guy-Perkins Elementary

School has been using the PLC process and examining student performance data regularly for the past two (2) years.

Finally, the Guy-Perkins School District has continued to work with our district stakeholders to help overcome much malicious misinformation being shared by others about our school district. Dear Arkansas State Board of Education:

My name is Dr. Joe Fisher and I have been the Superintendent of Guy-Perkins Schools since July 2020. The concerns shared by the Vickers family in their appeal letter dated 6/3/21 concern me deeply, but this is the first time I have been made aware of them in the two (2) years I have served the district. Even more concerning is that the mother, Becky Vickers, has worked hand-in-hand with our district leaders in the role of PTO Secretary/Treasurer until her recent resignation in May 2021. During the many hours of meeting and volunteering with the PTO, Mrs. Vickers has never once mentioned to me that her children were experiencing, or had experienced, any issues; that she was dissatisfied with the education her children were receiving; or that the reason she began home-schooling her children in August 2020 was a result of these issues. Each of these concerns could have been addressed at that time they occurred and possibly prevented this school-choice request (submitted on 3/1/21) and appeal two (2) years later.
