A.C. Houghton Elementary

Geography Bee

This annual event brings a lot of interest from students each year. This is a national competition that begins with individual tests given to fourth graders. The top scorers from each of the classes compete in a regular "Bee" on our stage with the student body in attendance. Our TAG coordinator works with classroom winners prior to this with a two-week tutorial to prepare them for the final competition.

Third Annual Writing Olympics

The ACH Annual Writing Olympics will be held at the end of this month. The opening ceremonies are participated in by third and fourth graders carrying banners that highlight the writing traits. This creates a great deal of enthusiasm for the beginning of our state writing testing process. Following the testing, and when we receive results back from the state, we hold a medals ceremony awarding gold, silver, and bronze for nearly meeting, meeting, and exceeding benchmarks.

Heppner Elementary School

As always it is a privilege to report the recent happenings of Heppner Elementary School. Winter Break seemed to fly by and it is hard to believe that 2008 has ended, and that 2009 is already here. Our enrollment as of today is 190 students which is up from my December report as we have just recently enrolled five new students at HES. Our current attendance percentage for the year is 95.93%. This unfortunately is down a little bit from last month due to the inclement weather prior to the break, but we will continue to promote the importance of regular attendance to the students and parents of Heppner Elementary School.

December was full of many exciting events which took place at HES, among the highlights was the "Winter Music Concert" directed by Mrs. Michelle Stone and Mr. Joe Lindsay which took place on Tuesday, December 16th 2008. It was a wonderful event and we have had many parents comment on how much they liked this year's combined concert. We also held the HES "Title Family Movie Night" on Thursday, December 11th 2008. I am happy to report that we had several people show up for a fun filled Title Program - Informational session, followed by the movie "*The Snowman*".

The HES Geography Bee will be held in the gym on Wednesday, January 7th at 1:30pm. Here are a couple of other important upcoming events for your calendars; January 15th is the end of the first semester and Martin Luther King Jr. Day will be observed on January 19th this year. There will be no school on this day, but "Freaky Friday" (the make up school day) will be held on January 23rd.

I would like to end this report by again thanking each of you for your support of Heppner Elementary School, and your commitment to all students of the Morrow County School District.

Heppner High School

- We held our first combined winter concert with the elementary school at HES. It was very good with our patrons coming to one place on one evening. Joe and his kids put on a tremendous program.
- With winter weather being a struggle, we have made some new improvements to getting information out to our parents and patrons via our website due to the ease of updating information in a matter of minutes. When making school closure decisions- our team of both Heppner principals, the bus company, and superintendent work together very early to make decisions that are based on the most up to date information possible. - FFA held its annual Greenhand initiation in the cafeteria, awarding 22 new members to the organization this year.
- Mrs. Dickenson and her AG classes went to the World Forestry Center for a field trip. This is an annual trip that our students get to experience many things that apply to real world technology and agriculture.
- I have been meeting with senior parents every month preparing for the after graduation drug and alcohol free party (called Project Graduation). Our senior water is here and will be sold at Heppner Family Foods and by seniors. Our slave auction fundraiser will be on January 23rd during half-time of the girls and boys basketball games. We are again working hard to make this night a special one for our outgoing seniors.
- Our I 17 process is in initial stage with the federal offices of immigration. We have had an on-site visit and now we are waiting for our license to be able to accept F1 visas of foreign students. This process should be complete by the end of the month.
- Our AP class numbers are as follows- AP Chemistry- 26 kids, AP Biology- 25 kids, AP Calculus- 17 kids, AP Government- 22 kids, AP English Language and Composition- 28 kids for a total of 118 students registered in these 5 classes.

Irrigon Elementary School

IES Professional Learning Community: At IES we make time in our weekly schedule to meet with each grade level and discuss instruction and curriculum. This month both grades have gotten together with me to continue to hash out our Math Power Standards for our school. With the help of the district teachers who are also giving us their opinions on other Math Standards from other districts, we are closing in on knowing what we want to teach and when we want students to know those standards. This PLC time is important because it gives us time to talk together on the teaching-learning direction of our school program.

Irrigon Jr./Sr. High School Key Club Volunteers at IES. Starting in January, IES will be receiving after school about 20 high school students to help in an After School Program of tutorial help and in supporting student clubs on Thursdays. We welcome the older kids coming across the street to help our students in homework and fun activities. This is a win-win situation!

IES Olympics: On December 11th we held our first IES Olympics. Ms. Osterlund one of our 6th grade teachers and her class put on a school-wide Olympic program. It had an Opening Ceremony, Sports Events, Closing Ceremony, and an Awards Presentation. The subject was tied into her class by reading, writing, and social studies. It was a wonderful success!

Second Round of OAKS testing: We are ready for the next round of OAKS tests. Our goal is to improve from last year's scores. We have two computer labs which makes our testing faster and more efficient. I will let you know how our results come out.

Irrigon High School

Attendance

During the first few months of school we have been averaging about 329 students. Our enrollment dipped slightly during December as some of our students left for Mexico. Overall, we had about fifteen students leave, but most are already back with the last few expected back by next week.

The winter weather wrecked havoc on our attendance rates the week before winter break. Up to that point, our overall weekly attendance average was 92.6%, slightly higher than last year at this time. However, with the inclement weather our attendance rate dropped 6% compared to the same week last year. We expect our attendance rates to rebound and will continue to explore ways to improve attendance.

AP - Update

This year our AP courses include U.S. History, Spanish Literature, and English Literature. Our current enrollment in these classes is 10, 15, and 25 students respectively. We are continuing working as a staff to increase the number of AP offerings for next year. At this point we are looking at adding at least two more to our course offerings which are English Composition and Studio Art.

5th Avenue - Update

We continue to promote our 5th Avenue program on Fridays to provide additional help for students. At this point, we are averaging just over twelve students at each session. Our counselor also regularly attends our 5th Avenue program to help students with career and college research and scholarship applications. We expect more and more students to utilize her help with these endeavors as we quickly approach important deadlines. Several parents accompany their student as they meet with her.

Recently, a flyer has been circulating around town stating that the city of Irrigon has teamed with the Oregon Department of Transportation and a team of transportation, urban design and economic specialists to create a Downtown Plan and US 730 Streetscape Plan for Downtown Irrigon. The purpose of the Plan is to enhance the safety, beauty, and vitality of Downtown. I visited with our leadership class and explained what the meeting was about and the kind of input these groups would be looking to receive. I then asked the group to brainstorm ideas and improvements they would like to see around town to make it a better place – a place where families and businesses would like to call home. Finally, I asked the group to send a couple of students as representatives to a public meeting to present their ideas from a student / young person's point of view. This is a great opportunity for our school and students to get involved in something that has the potential to have a huge impact on their community and to demonstrate their commitment to making Irrigon a better place. It also helps provide students with a 'bigger picture' of how things work, how things are planned out, and the time commitment necessary to make these kinds of projects happen.
