Mr. Malisia is using a QR code system this year that scans each student's card, records students' individual laps and generates a spreadsheet of results. This is a safer alternative, during these times of Covid restrictions, to the previously used popsicle stick method. This will be a change that he will continue on with because of its efficiency for record keeping.

Life Health Safety

Fire Drills: We have completed the 3 required fire drills the first on 9/22/20. All students were able to exit the building and gather safely outside in 2 minutes and 15 seconds. The second drill occurred on 10/1/20 in 1 minute and 55 seconds. The third drill was with the fire department on 10/8/20 and all students were able to exit the building and gather safely outside in 1 minute and 11 seconds.

Shake Out: Lincoln Elementary took part in the National Earthquake Drill on 10/16/19. **LockDown:** Lincoln Elementary practiced a lockdown drill on 9-25-20 while maintaining social distancing. Teachers went through the procedures of the drill by locking the room and pulling the shades. Students sat quietly at their desks as the teachers explained where they would go and what they would do in the case that it was not a drill. The same procedure was practiced a second time on 10/13/20 with law enforcement from the Pana Police Department.

October STEAM/Makerspace Committee Meeting

The recently developed Makerspace Committee met to discuss ways to allocate funds from the whole school "In the Trenches" grant for creating a makerspace in the library. The committee consists of the technology integration specialist, the librarian, the principal and 4 teacher representatives from each grade level. With the new chromebooks we have received, Lincoln Elementary has met the goal set 2 years ago to become a one to one school. Accomplishing this eliminates further need for a computer lab. As a result, the makerspace will be moved to the library area where the lab once was and the room will be more fully developed. By marrying these two areas, the committee discussed how best to use the physical space, and prioritized the items to be purchased for the space. Brainstorming about items to be used in the space occurred along with the discussion of phase one for dismantling the lab and compiling additional feedback from each grade level for ways to use the space. A vision statement was discussed as well. It will coincide with the building mission statement of "Building Independent Thinkers and Problem Solvers One Student At A Time. The next meeting will take place in November.
