






Change in the Child Population (Age 0-17 years)
Twin Cities Metropolitan Cities, 2015-2020





## Within the Twin Cities: Range of growth and decline scenarios




## Number of births remains down by about 9,000 compared to the height in 2007




#### 70% of Minnesota school-age children live with two married adults

#### Household Type of Minnesota School-Age Children Ages 5 to 17 Years




## About 21% of school-age children live with only one parent

#### For 80% of Minnesota school children all parents in the household are in the labor force


Living Arrangements of Children by Parents' Labor Force Status Minnesota Children Ages 6 to 17 Years

# 2021: 272,000 (28%) Minnesota school-age children live in low-income families



#### In 2021:

- Federal Poverty Level for a family of 4: \$27,479
- 200% the Federal Poverty Level for a Family of 4 (Low-Income): \$54,958
- 110,000 School-Age Children Lived in Poverty (11%)
- An additional 161,000 lived in families with low incomes (17%)
