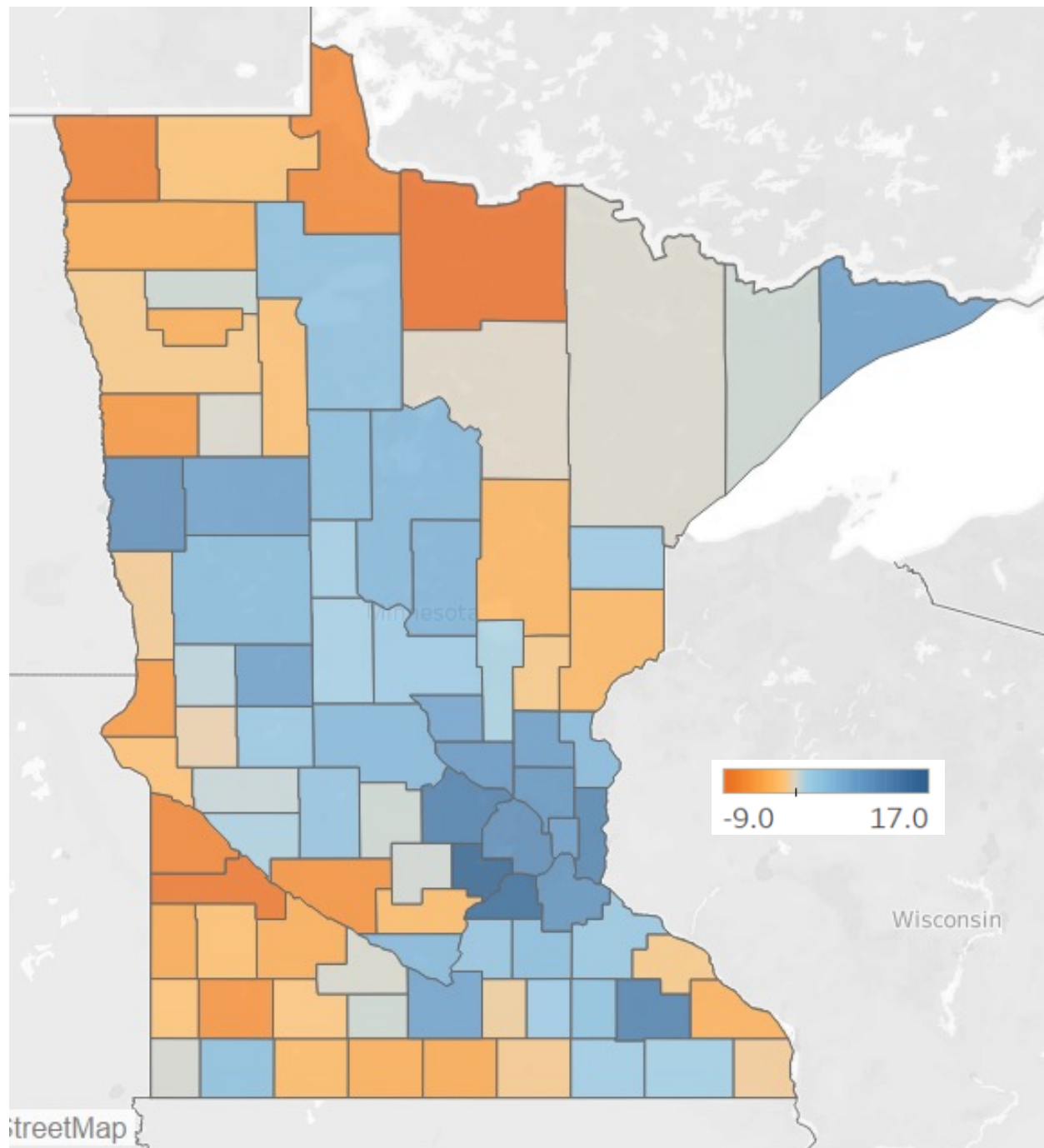

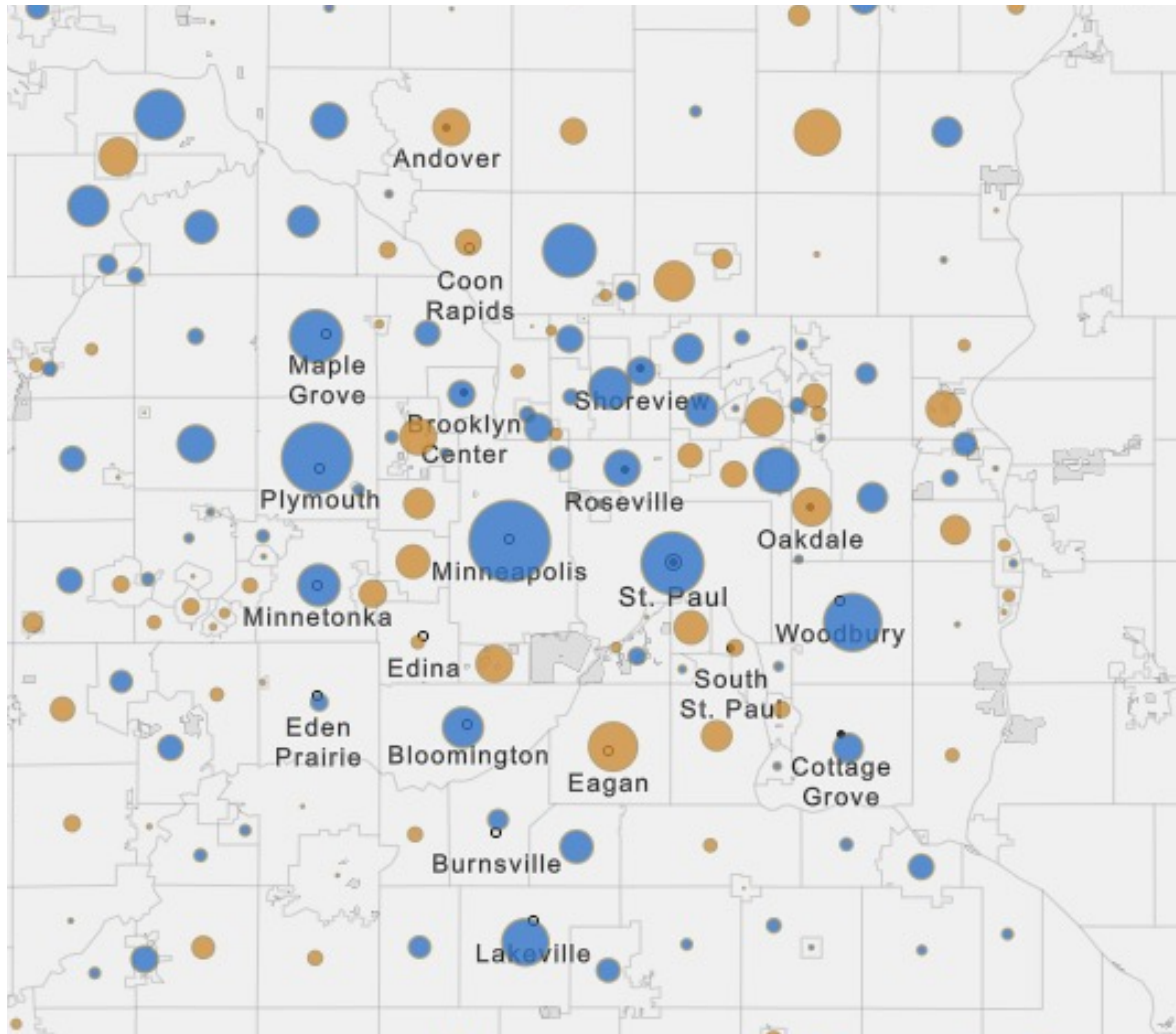
# Percent Change, Total Population, 2010-2020

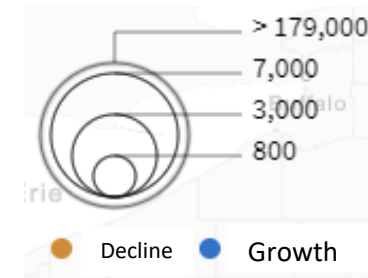

## Change in the Child Population (Age 0-17 years) Twin Cities Metropolitan Cities, 2015-2020

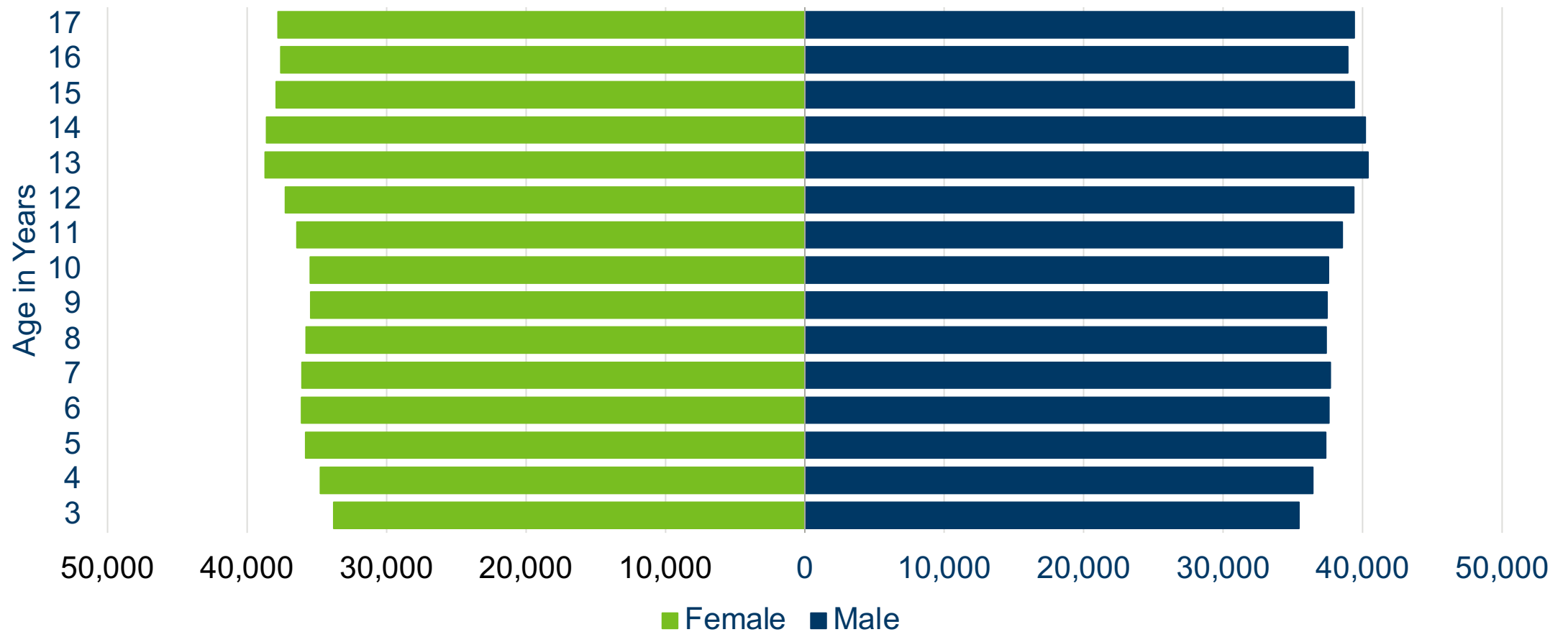

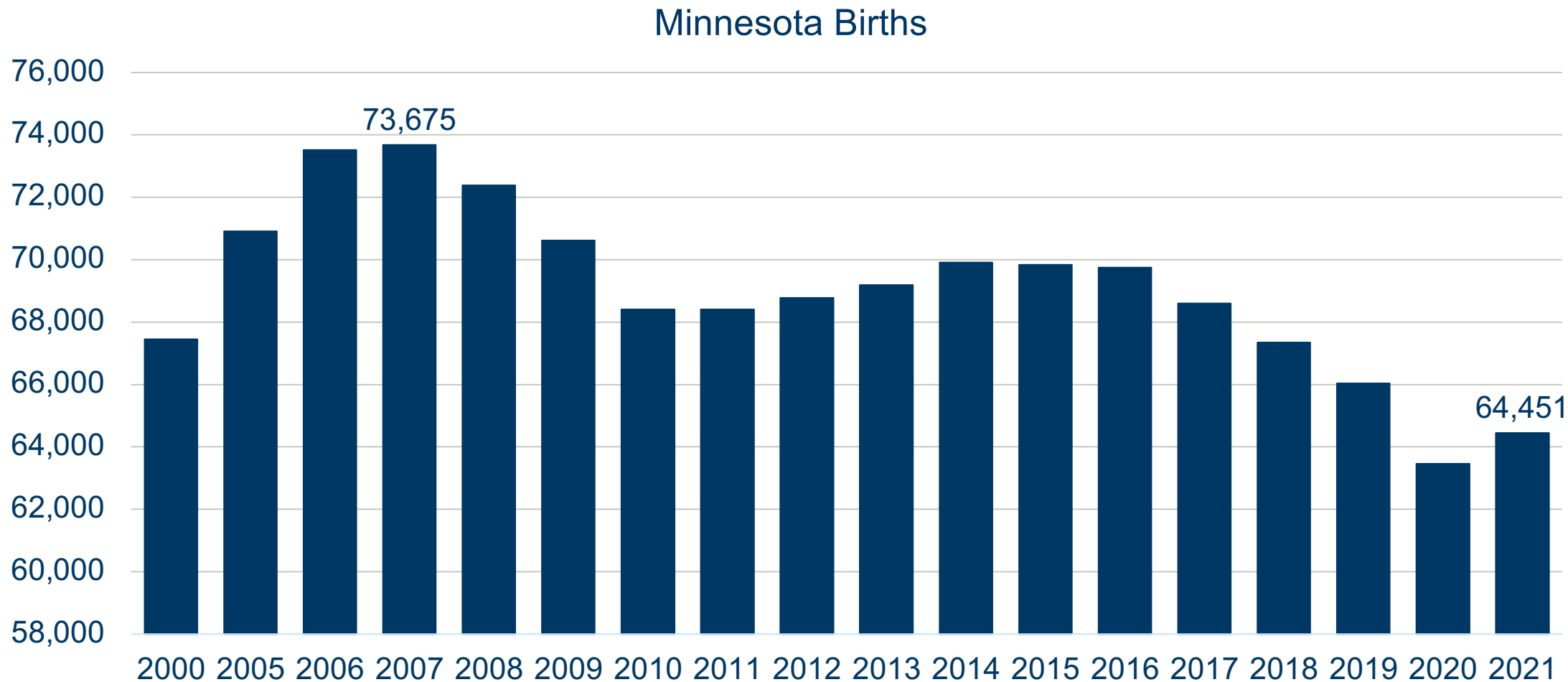

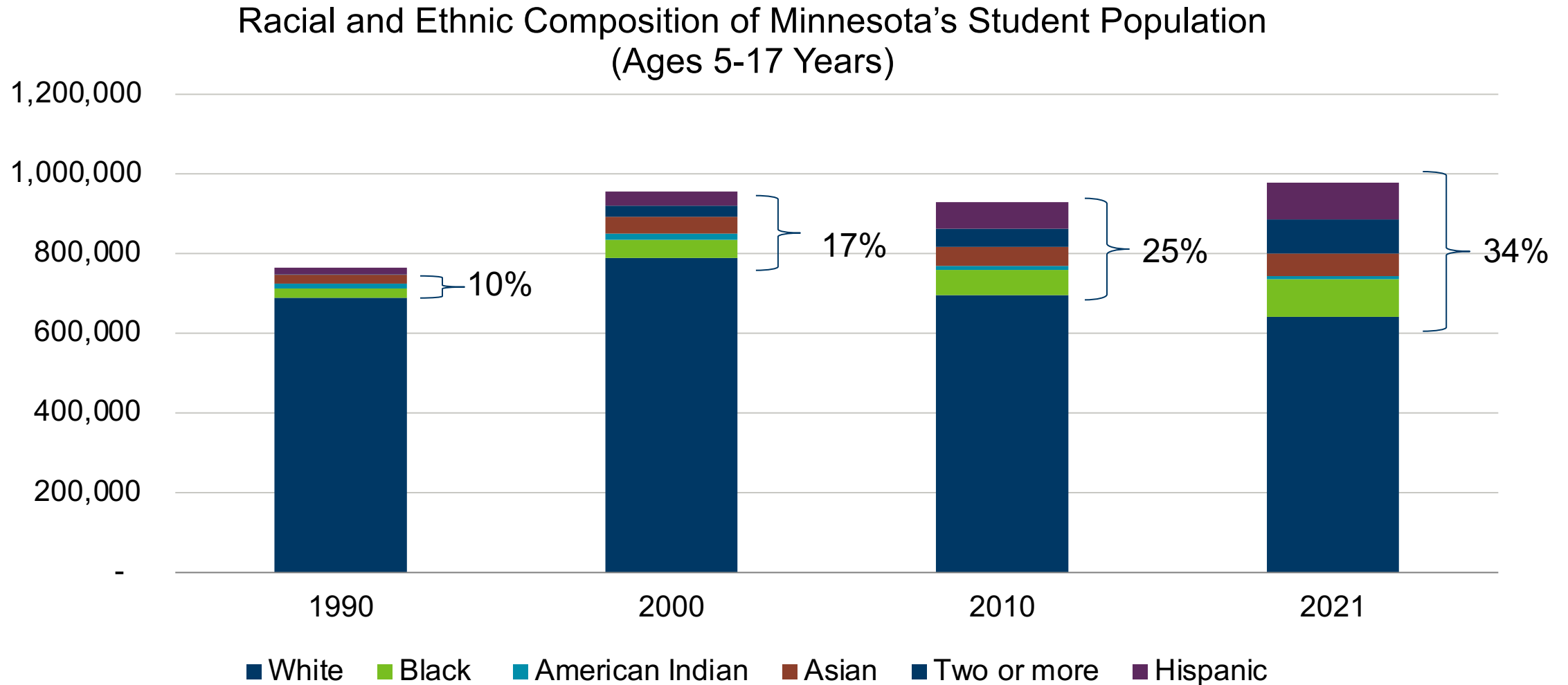
Minnesota's School-Age Population, 2021

# Number of births remains down by about 9,000 compared to the height in 2007

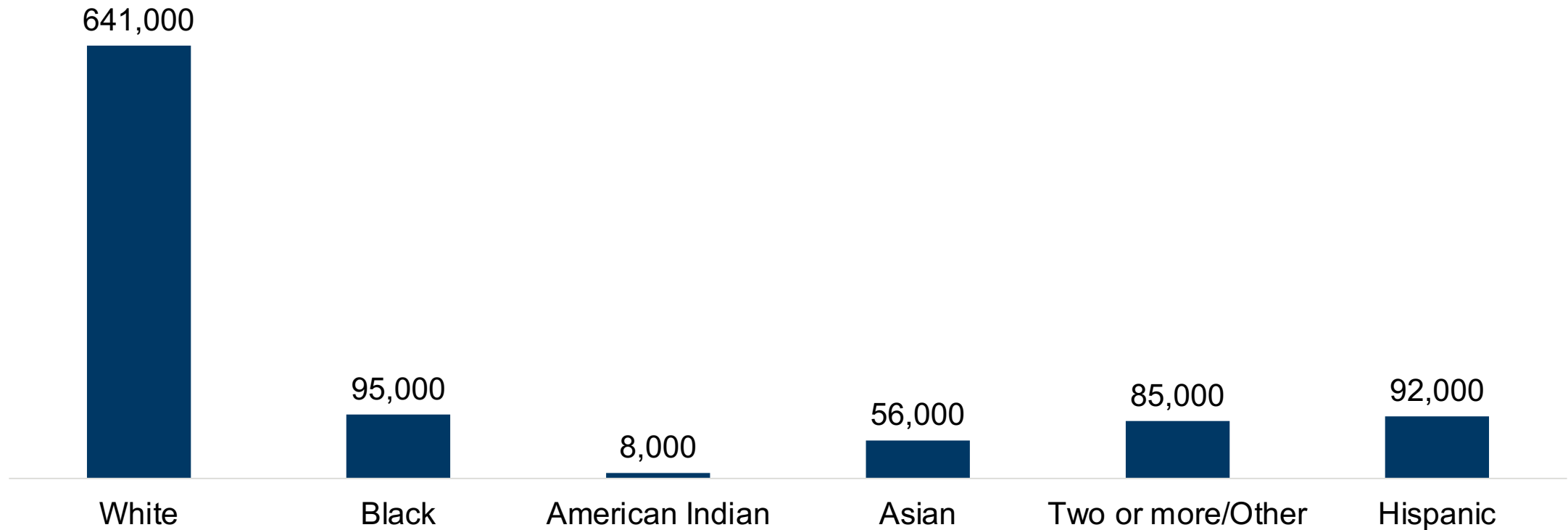


# More than 1/3 of Minnesota's student population identifies as Black, Indigenous, or a Person of Color

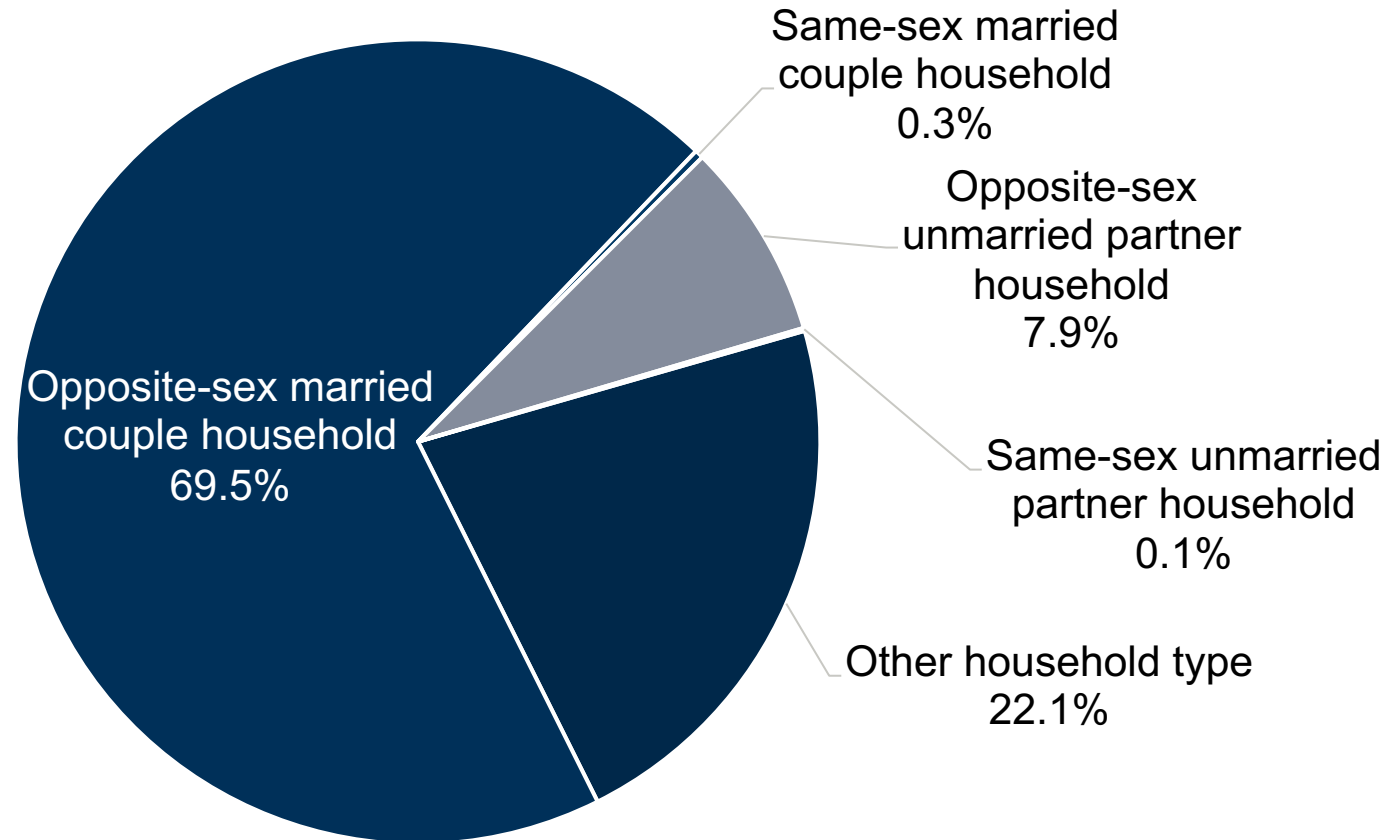

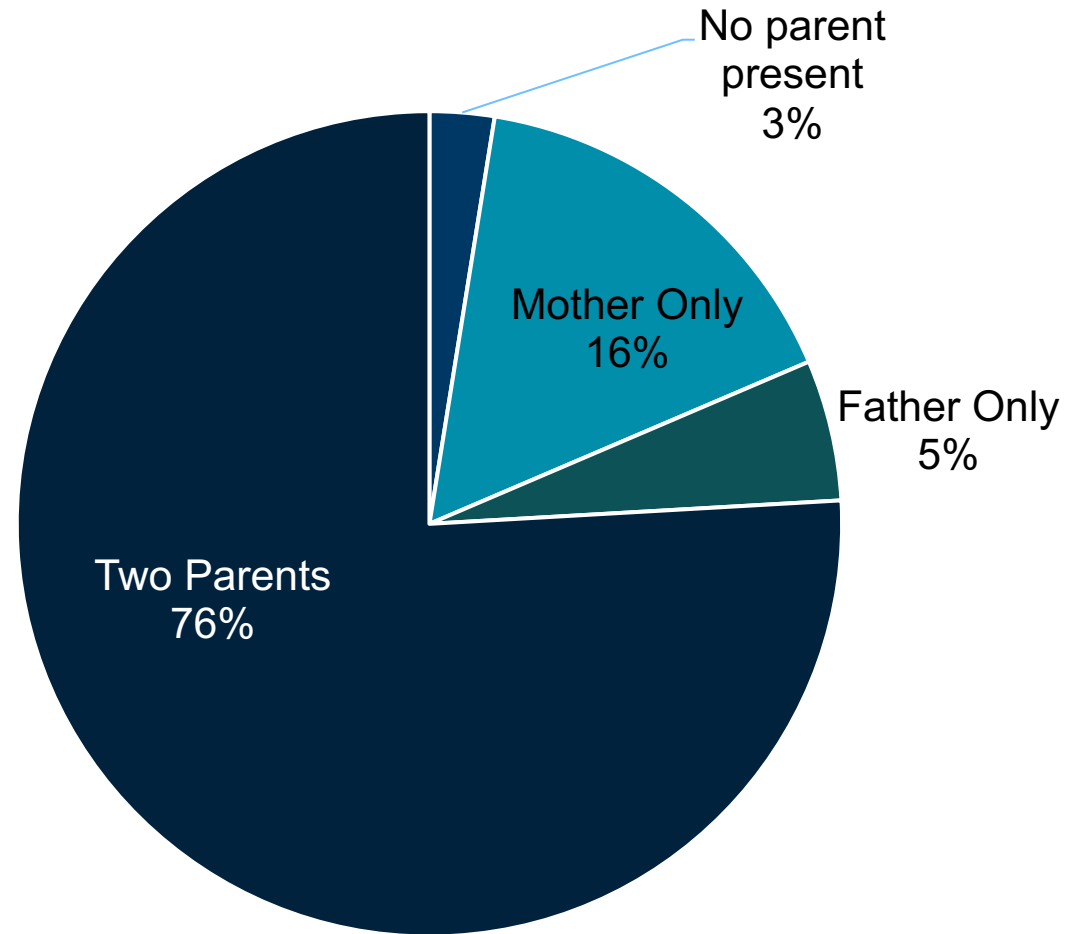
# 70% of Minnesota school-age children live with two married adults

Ages 5 to 17 Years



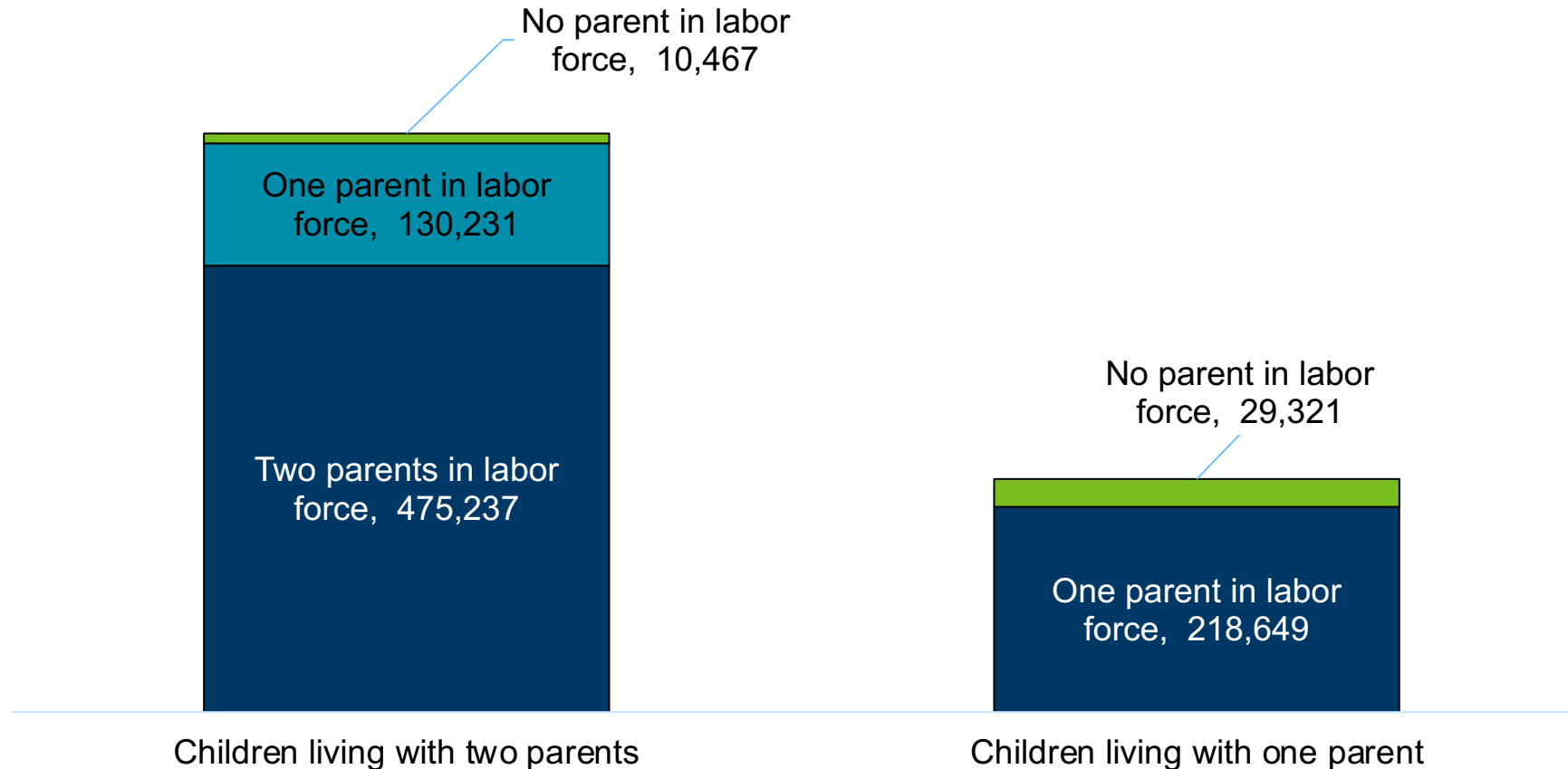
# About 21% of school-age children live with only one parent

Minnesota Children Ages 5 to 17 years



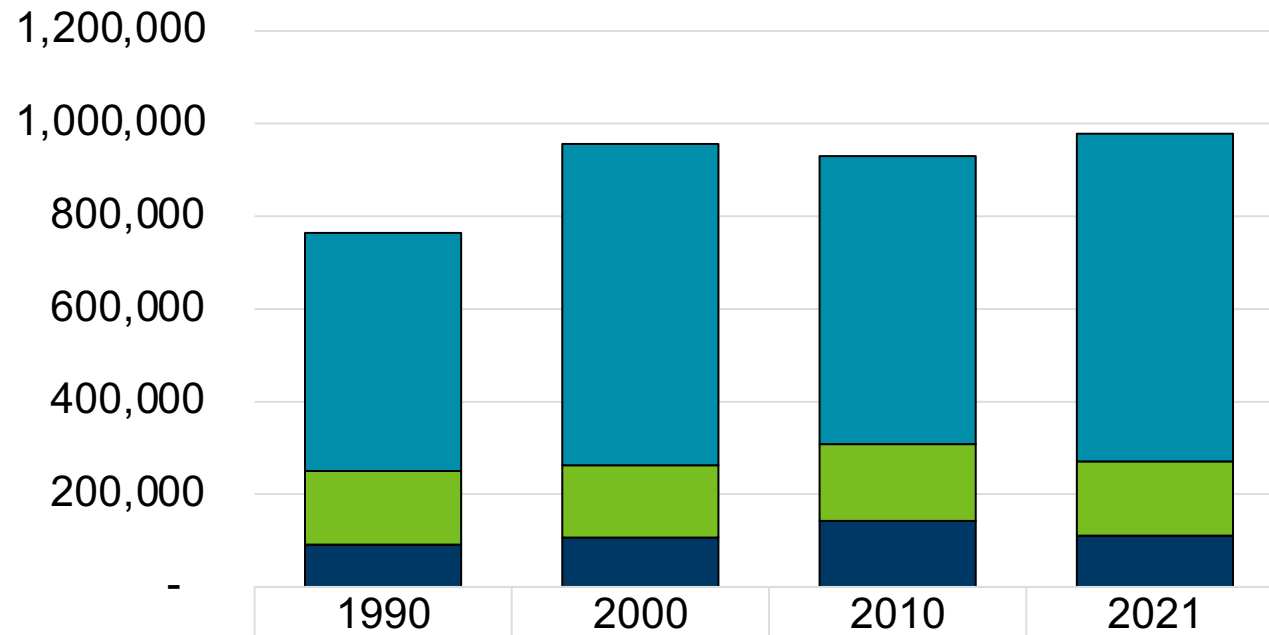
# For 80% of Minnesota school children all parents in the household are in the labor force

Poverty Status of Children Ages 5-17



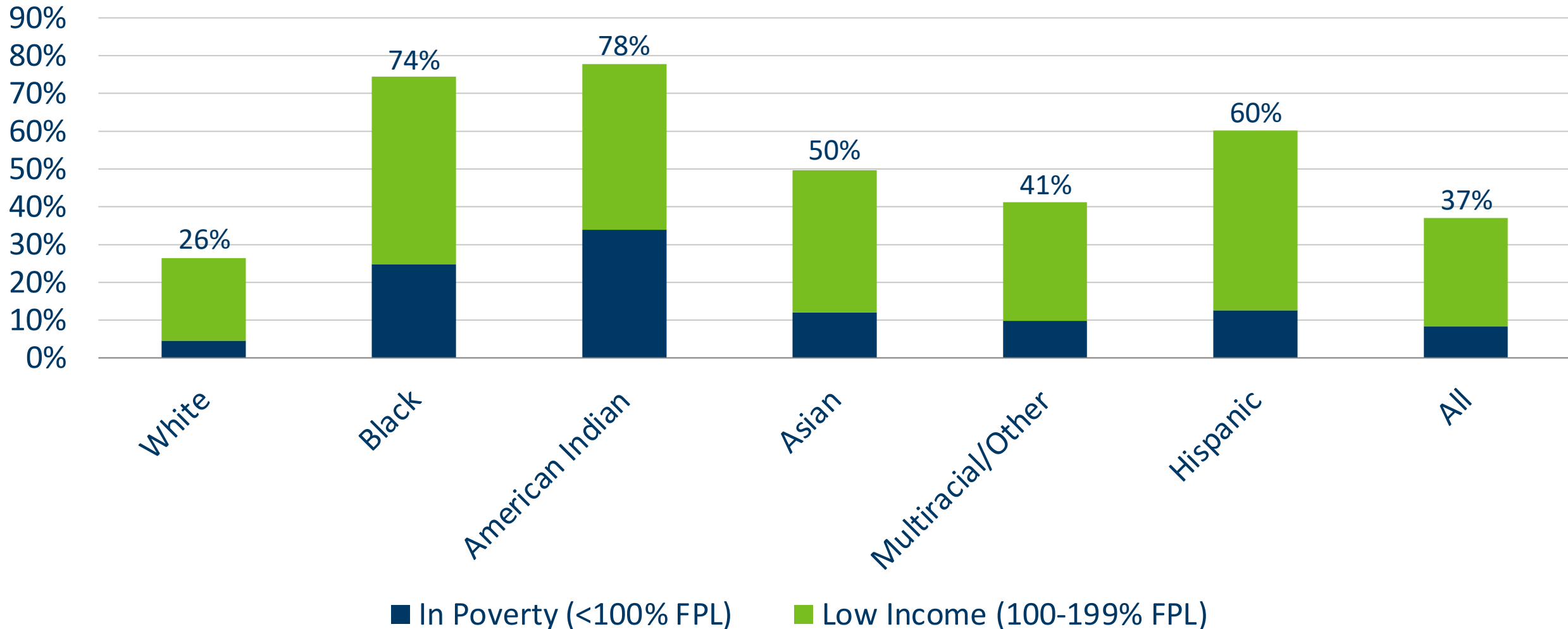
■ Middle Income and Above (200%+ FPL)

In 2021:

- Federal Poverty Level for a family of 4: \$27,479
- 200% the Federal Poverty Level for a Family of 4 (Low-Income): \$54,958
- 110,000 School-Age Children Lived in Poverty (11%)
- An additional 161,000 lived in families with low incomes (17%)
