Day 1 – 5 AM – Classroom Instruction in the following areas:

- Student Responsibilities
- Course Overview
- Maintenance of Gear and Kennel
- K-9 Health and Welfare
- Training and Utilization Records
- Detector Dog Handling and Training Techniques

Day 1 – 5 PM – Practical Application (introduction of detection dog handling)

Day 6 – 10 AM – Classroom Instruction in the following areas:

- Principles of Conditioning
- Search techniques
- Vehicle Search
- Building Search
- Open Area Search
- Tracking

Day 6 – 10 PM

- Practical Application training from basic searches to more advanced training problems

Day 11 AM — Students will demonstrate their current level of proficiency, technique and knowledge by working their K9's in narcotic detection.

Day 11 PM—Instructor will critique/discuss students demonstrated level of technique and knowledge, followed by practical work on areas discussed.

Day 12 AM— Practical work will be done to either resolve problems identified the previous days or advance the abilities of the working teams.
