# TITLE 1 PROGRAM EXPECTATIONS AT LBMS

Our school receives federal funds for Title One programs that are part of the No Child Left Behind Act. Under this law, you have the right to request information regarding the professional qualifications of your child's classroom teacher(s). If you request this information, the district will provide you with this information in a timely manner. You have the right to request the following information:

- If the teacher has met state licensing requirements for the grade level and subjects in which the teacher is providing instruction
- If the teacher is teaching under an emergency status for which state licensing requirements have been waived
- The type of college degree major of the teacher and the field of discipline for any graduate degrees and certificates
- If your child is receiving Title One services from paraprofessionals and if so, his/her qualifications

EACH LORNA BYRNE STUDENT IS ALLOWED TO HAVE <u>3 BOOKS CHECKED OUT FOR 3 WEEKS</u>. IF THE BOOKS ARE RETURNED ON TIME OR RENEWED BEFORE THE DUE DATE, NO FINES ACCRUE. **IF THE BOOKS ARE NOT RETURNED OR RENEWED BEFORE THE DUE DATE THEN A .05¢ FINE IS CHARGED FOR EACH BOOK, EACH DAY UNTIL IT IS RETURNED OR RENEWED**. IN THE CASE THAT BOOKS ARE LOST OR DAMAGED BEYOND REPAIR, THE STUDENT WILL BE REQUIRED TO PAY THE REPLACEMENT PRICE. WHEN FINES REACH AN EXCESSIVE AMOUNT AND/OR THERE IS A HISTORY OF LOST/DAMAGED BOOKS, STUDENTS MAY LOSE THEIR LIBRARY PRIVELEDGES. #### **IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS**

On February 2, 2011, Department of Human Services (Public Health Division) will be sending out "Exclusion Notices" to those parents whose children have not received immunizations required in order to attend public school.

Students entering 6<sup>th</sup> Grade are required to have received the following:

- 5 Diphtheria/Tetanus/Pertussis (DTap)
- 4 Polio
- 1 Varicella (chickenpox) or has had the disease
- 2 Measles
- 1 Mumps
- 1 Rubella
- 3 Hepatitis B

Students entering 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> Grade should have received these immunizations plus have had one dose of Tdap if it has been at least 5 years since the last administration of tetanus-containing vaccine.

Please check your student's immunization records. Vaccines are available at LBMS' Student Health Center (542) 592-6978), your personal doctor's office and at the Josephine County Public Health Department.


Exclusion date is February 16, 2011. If your student has not received the necessary immunizations, they will not be able to attend school. If your student is up-to-date on immunizations and you receive a letter from the Department of Human Services, please bring in your updated information to Lorna Byrne Middle School so we may be able to update our records.

# **Boosting Middle-School Students' Academic Vocabulary**

(Originally titled "The Words Students Need")

"When students enter middle school, they encounter increasingly difficult textbooks and instructional materials," say literacy experts Joshua Lawrence, Claire White, and Catherine Snow in this *Educational Leadership* article. "Many students begin to struggle with reading comprehension because they lack the vocabulary to understand academic text." The authors say that middle-school students need a systematic school-wide vocabulary program if they are to become proficient at reading, writing, listening, and speaking.

But which words should be taught? Not the common words that all students know, say Lawrence, White, and Snow. Not content-specific words that students will learn in their science, social studies, and math classes. The school-wide program should teach general academic vocabulary - words like *distribute, conclusion, proceed, logical, obtain, acquire, retain, exclude, attribute, assume, capacity, enable, perspective, relevant, perceive, component, restrict, generate, distinct, assess, alter, amend, and contrast.* Students will encounter words like these in many academic contexts across subject areas. A good source for such words is the Academic Word list –

http://www.victoria.ac.nz/lals/resources/academicwordlist/information.aspx. Another list that presents the 86,800 most frequently used English words, in rank order, is available at http://www.wordcount.org/main.php.

#### BULLYING AND HARASSMENT By: Darrell Erb

Horror stories of students taking their own lives as a result of repeated bullying and harassment have dominated the media lately, and schools are, as a result, under a microscope. Fair enough – as a father myself, I want to know that my children are safe at school. Further, I want to know if they are being mistreated in any way, there are adults at school who are willing to do something about it!

I have fielded many questions as of late regarding what it is we are doing at LBMS about bullying and harassment. I am pleased to report LBMS is very proactive in preventing bullying and harassment. Specifically, here's what we are doing:

- Building upon last year, we have begun a student-led initiative to prevent (as much as is possible) bullying and harassment in our school – a group of students and experts from the Josephine County Women's Crisis Center are working together to create a more caring, inclusive school culture through various strategies
- Utilizing our advisory period (1/2 hour at the beginning of each day), we will, in parallel to the studentled initiative, begin teaching our students what bullying is, what it looks like, and what it feels like to be bullied
- We will employ effective practices, such as teaching students how to say "stop" if they are being bullied; teaching a student who is bullying how to appropriately respond to being told to stop, and, as importantly, teaching our students, when they are bystanders to bullying, how to appropriately and safely respond to help bullying victims.

Of course, students can report bullying and harassment in the main office. When a report is made, we respond first with an intervention which calls upon the parties involved to cooperate to find a solution. If this does not work, then school discipline is employed, and appropriate consequences are given based upon the guidelines set forth by the TRSD Board of Directors.

We look forward to a great year at LBMS! Give Mr. Erb, Dean of Students, a call, or stop by to meet, if you have questions, concerns, or something to report. We look forward to continuing communicating with the great parents of LBMS!

## STUDENT ABSENCES AND EXCUSES

Daily attendance and punctuality are absolutely necessary for a student to gain maximum benefits from his/her educational experience.

Oregon school law supports the Board's view, and restricts excused absences to illness of the student, student medical or dental appointments (confirmation of appointments may be required), illness in the immediate family which requires the student's presence at home, when the tenets of the student's religion require an absence for religious observance of a holiday or emergency situations that require the student's absence. All other absences must meet the approval of the school officials or be treated as unexcused absences. An absence that does not meet the criteria of an excused absence but has been confirmed by the parent will be marked as a "verified" absence.

Absences will only be excused or verified if a phone call is received from the parent/guardian the day the student is absent or a note received in the school office not more than 3 days after the child returned to school.
