Robotics: Our qualifying tournament completed the season for the North Coast League with Team 14687 - Cybernetic Chaos getting the Innovate Trophy as well as a finalist alliance trophy - they will be representing NKN at the University of Portland on Feb. 11th and 12th at the FTC Second Chance Tournament. NKN Robotics will also be hosting a Robotics Bootcamp March 6th-9th for 6th graders and other students interested in participating in Robotics next year.

Choir: NKN MS/HS Choir held a town hall meeting at the Rockaway Roastery on Feb. 4th to discuss the donation of \$50,000 worth of musical equipment and instruments gifted to the group and how to best serve student musicians throughout the district. Activity Updates

Leo's Club: The Leo's club has been busy this year. They have volunteered at the FNRL event, Wrapped presents at the Rockaway Roasters, volunteered at the Veterans dinner at the Lion's Club, and volunteered at the Pancake breakfast. We have many more events planned in the coming months.

FBLA: On January 28th, 7 students competed in the Regional skills conference in Canby. All of them placed and will be going to State in April.

Art Club: After beginning the year doing our own artwork, the club is watching and following a short tutorial on various types of art medium. Activity Updates

National Ocean Sciences Bowl: Students recently completed a marine debris survey in partnership with Jesse Jones from CoastWatch and Denise Harrington with NOAA at Manhattan Beach Wayside. This community science survey will be completed monthly in order to monitor the amount and type of debris found on our beaches, as well as the conditions and recreational use of the our beaches. The 12-member NOSB team also traveled to OSU to attend a 2-day science event on 2/3-2/4, where they met with OSU faculty and graduate students to learn about their studies and research opportunities at OSU. They also toured a number of labs on campus, including the wave lab, ice lab, laser lab, and learned from researchers and grad students about how you can evaluate past ocean conditions (even up to 800,000 year ago!) from looking at ice cores and “shells” of certain ocean organisms, and how ocean acidification is currently affecting organisms like oysters and crabs.

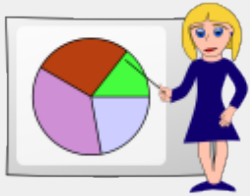

Curriculum Information:

Financial Planning and Intro to Business-

We will align with TBCC for dual credit, and use ancillary support curriculum from the MBA Research website which is constantly being updated for current market trends in the business world. These are ODE approved National Resources.

Language Arts- we will be piloting next year in anticipation of adopting new materials for the 2023-2024 school year. We are exploring Houghton Mifflin, one of the top rated state approved curriculums.

Mathematics- The state has adopted new math standards and has modified the required credits to reflect both college and CTE pathways after graduation. We will be working to realign our math scope and sequence to reflect the new standards.

Spanish- We will be piloting new materials in anticipation of adopting in 22-23.
