#2280 1 **Uniform Treatment of Recruiters** 2 3 Subject to the provisions of law, all recruiters, including commercial, military and 4 nonmilitary concerns, recruiters representing institutions of higher education, and 5 6 prospective employers shall be provided equal opportunities of access to students 7 enrolled in the district's secondary school[s]. 8 Except as provided below, military recruiters and institutions of higher education shall, 9 10 upon request, be given access to the names, addresses and telephone numbers of secondary school students. 11 12 13 On an annual basis, the school district will notify parents of secondary school students of 14 their right to object to the disclosure of the student's name, address and telephone number to military recruiters or to an institution of higher education. If a secondary school 15 student or the parent of a secondary school student objects in writing to the disclosure of 16 a student's name, address or telephone number to a military recruiter or an institution of 17 higher education, then the district shall not disclose the student's name, address or 18 telephone number to a military recruiter or an institution of higher education. The 19 objection shall remain in force until the district re-issues the annual notification 20 referenced above, after which time the parents and/or secondary school student must 21 inform the school district in writing again of their objection to the disclosure of the 22 23 information described above. 24 25 Legal References: 26 27 Conn.
