**Northwestern Class “A”**

The South and North West Class A Conferences will be proposing the MHSA in January 2019 to become one conference. The proposal will have the teams playing a 9 game football schedule. These games will all count towards season final results to determine which team qualify for the playoffs. The number 1 and 2 teams will receive a bye in the first round of the play offs, the 3 team will play the 6 team and the 4 and 5 teams will play each other in the first round of the play offs. The winner of the 3 team vs the 6 team will advance to play against the number 2 team from the east. The winner of the 4 team vs the 5 team will advance to pay against the number 1 team from the east for 2019.
