## Background Information:

The goal of the Navarro Education Foundation grant program is to focus on creative and innovative opportunities for student learning beyond what is available through district funds. It is to provide additional enrichment for students and elevate education experiences. Persons eligible are individuals or teams of individuals employed by Navarro ISD who are involved in the instruction of students or related support services benefiting students. Grants awarded are up to \$3,000 for an individual grant or up to \$10,000 for a collaborative grant across classes, grades, schools or the district. The number of grants awarded are determined by the funds available and the NEF Board of Directors. As of the Fall of 2024 NEF has funded over \$792,000 in grants awarded to NISD classrooms and impacted every campus.

The generosity of NEF and longstanding partnership with Navarro ISD helps us achieve our mutual missions and fosters alignment with nearly all priorities within the collaborative vision.
