I. Presentations - DATCU Award

DATCU has received the Education Excellent Gold Level Award from the Texas State Board of Education for its outstanding support of Texas public schools, and especially Denton ISD. Dale Kimble, CEO, and Pat Sherman, vice president of business development, are representing DATCU.

DATCU's many contributions to Denton ISD schools include:

- DATCU is one of the top adopters in Denton ISD's Adopt-A-School: *Partners in Education* program. Pat Sherman served as the chair for two years. The AAS Council programs include overseeing the Community Offering One-on-One Learning (COOL), which is the district's mentoring program.
- Twenty DATCU employees committed to a one-year mentoring program with Big Brothers /Big Sisters working with students at Newton Rayzor Elementary School through Communities in Schools.

DHS senior earns National Merit honor; 21 get NMS honors

One Denton High senior has been named a National Merit Semifinalist while 21 others have received national honors in this nationwide scholars program.

National Merit Semifinalists

Omar Akram, Denton High senior, was among the highest scoring entrants in the 2014 National Merit Scholarship program in Texas and part of an elite group of only 16,000 semifinalists chosen nationwide.

He is the son of Javed and Zahida Akram. He plans to attend the University of Oklahoma and major in biology. He is president of the DHS Math Club, vice president of Spanish Honor Society, and secretary of the UIL Spelling Team.

With this honor, Omar is eligible to receive one of 8,300 Merit Scholarship awards. The total scholarship money is more than \$35 million. Less than one percent of students taking the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test qualify as National Merit Semifinalists.

Commended Scholars

Fifteen Denton ISD seniors also were recognized as commended scholars by the 2014 National Merit Scholarship Program.

There are less than 34,000 commended scholars recognized by the National Merit Scholarship program nationwide annually and each placed in the top five percent on the PSAT/NMSQT test.

Denton ISD has had more than 100 National Merit Commended Scholars in the past decade and about 35 National Merit Semifinalists.
