EVENTS

We have had a busy first few weeks of school. We started the year off with a freshman only orientation day. We had 130 freshman show up for orientation. They also added a little fun with a “Battle of the Groups.” The freshmen competed against each other in friendly competition. The cheerleaders also taught the freshmen some class cheers so they would be prepared for our first all student assembly. We had 140 freshmen attend the orientation.

On the first full day of school for all students we started the day off with a welcome back assembly. At the end of the day we had an ice cream social for students and staff.

ACADEMICS

With an increased number of students enrolled at the high school this year we have a lot of class sections with a high enrollment. The counselors have been busy preparing student schedules and trying to even out class load numbers.

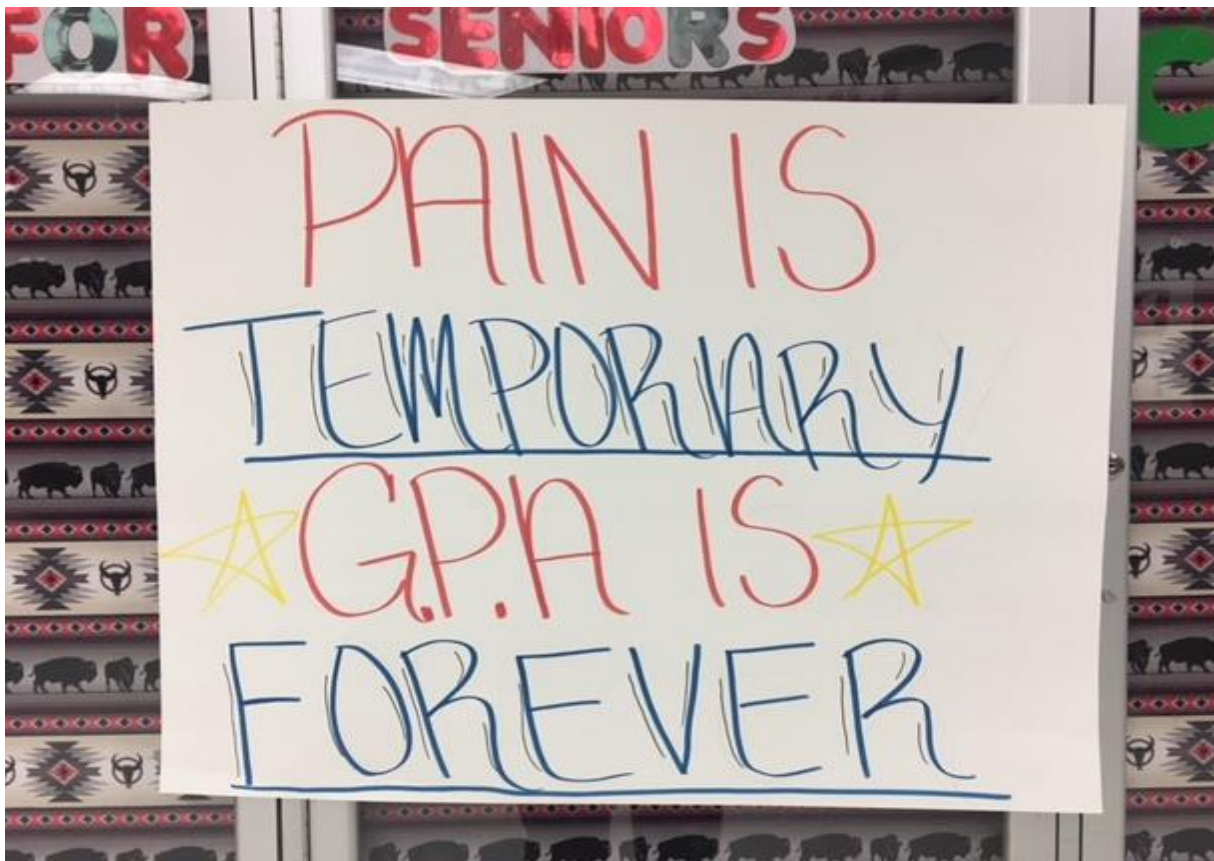
