I would appreciate being considered for the temporary open seat on the school board. I have three children enrolled in the CCSD with one on an IEP. Since 2020, I have attended more than half of the school board meetings and participated in many additional meetings such as the strategic plan community meetings, Title I-A parent and staff meetings, the special education work group, and budget advisory committee meetings. Since 2017, I have been a volunteer for many class trips and events as well as an active member of the PTSA. During the current academic year, I have enjoyed being a weekly classroom volunteer in the kindergarten class. As a result, I have developed a deep respect for the CCSD, formed close bonds with many of the students, become well acquainted with the strengths and struggles of a variety of staff, and furthered my desire to see our district prosper.

I am currently serving as a council member for the city with my term ending in October. It was confirmed with a local government specialist in Juneau that there is no state prohibition for a person serving in both roles. CCSD bylaws have no exclusion for this as well. Alaska Statute 29 states you cannot hold the mayor's seat and council seat, but there is no mention of the school board. Alaska Statute 14 states you need only to be a municipal voter to be qualified for a school board seat.

I understand the time to serve in this board seat would be brief, but I would do my best to promote the best interests of the students and district. Per your request, I have attached my resume. Also, I would be happy to provide references and/or any additional follow-up information you require.

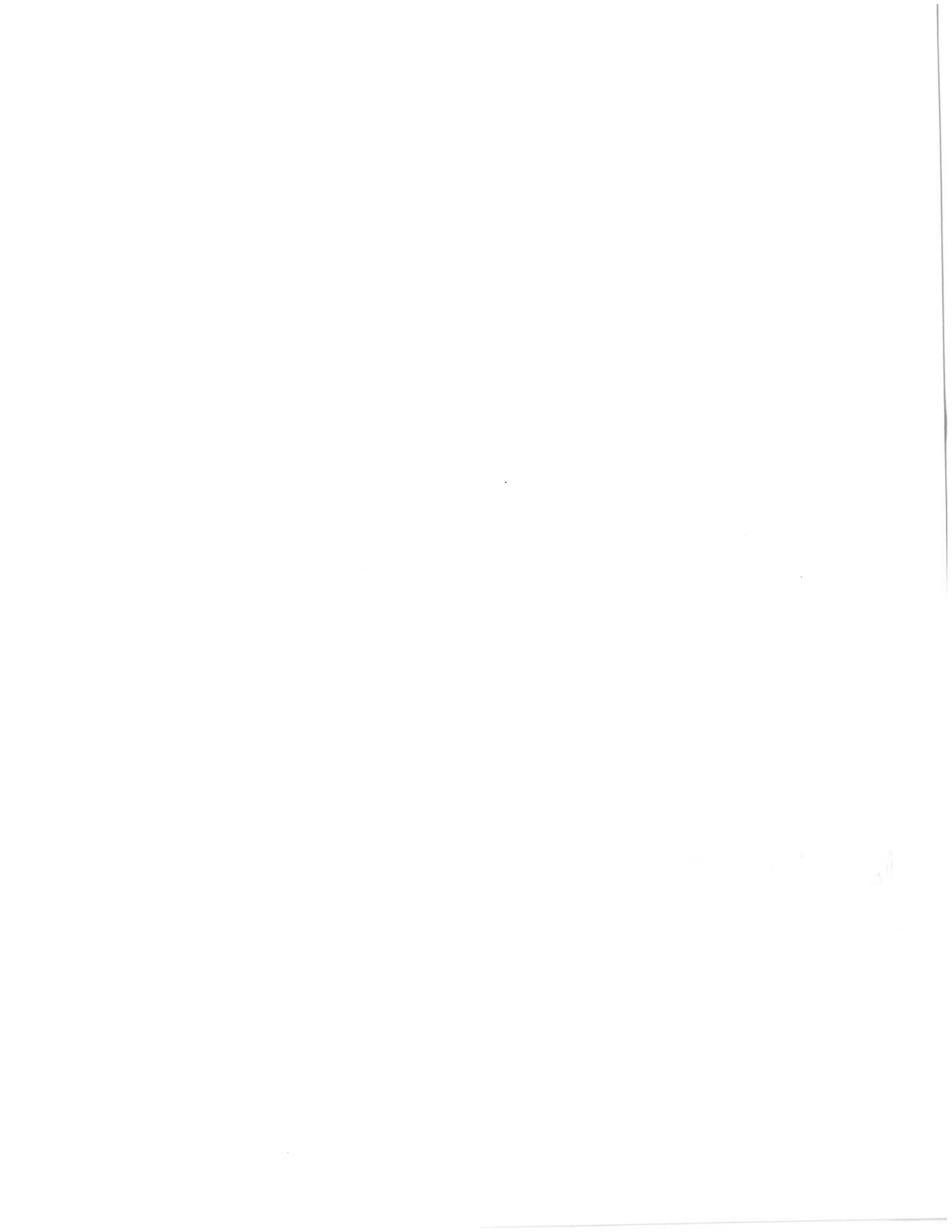
