IMPROVING COMMUNICATION BETWEEN SCHOOL AND HOME

Communication is a tricky thing as it involves more than one person and there are multiple variables for all parties. The speaker or the writer must speak and write and the listener or reader must hear or read what was said. If the communicator does not do their job or if the person receiving the communication does not listen carefully or read thoroughly, there is what is called a "communication break down". It is a goal of the school to do a better job of communicating with parents.

To that end it is our goal to do the following:

- Send out this parent newsletter approximately once a month.
- Use Synervoice for updates and important events.
- Use Synervoice as well as the Attendance Clerk, Ms. Paul, to keep you informed of your student's attendance.
- Keep our school webpage current.
- Respond to parent emails and phone calls within 24 hours during the school week.
- Keep the Reader Board at the front of the school updated.
- Get information to the IV News in a timely fashion.
- Offer parents the ability to access Parent Assist and keep informed of their student's academic progress as well as attendance and behaviors.

What we especially need from parents is the following:

- Read the newsletters. Many parents have admitted to us that they either just toss them or that they don't open them. Communication is broken when this happens.
- Transfer important dates and events to your home or computer calendar.
- Listen to the Synervoice messages. Don't just ignore them when you see the school is calling. Sometimes those messages will have attendance information but often will have important news.
- If you have access to a computer and an email account, sign up for Parent Assist and check your student's account at least weekly.

If you have not yet signed up for *Parent Assist* through our student information system, eSIS, come by the school and see Janie Pope. You do need access to a computer and an email account. *Parent Assist* will allow you to check on your student's academic progress as well as attendance, progress toward graduation, and many other things.

If you are already in *Parent Assist*, please know that all teachers will make sure their gradebooks are up to date each Tuesday morning—for all work due the previous week. There will be times that your student may say that what looks like a missing assignment is turned in but it is still showing up as missing in the gradebook you are seeing. Since it is impossible for teachers to keep up with grading on a daily basis, what you are looking for when you check may not be an accurate reflection of what has been turned in. However, if you check on Tuesday, you should be able to know that any blank places in the gradebook indicate work that has not been turned in.

Attention Seniors and Parents:

Senior Class Safe and Sober Grad Night meets the second Wednesday of every month at the high school at 6:00 PM. It is for all graduating seniors. A letter will be sent out informing all parents of what is expected of them and their graduating senior. If you are a senior parent, get involved with this group. They need the help. It is difficult when a few parents are taking on the responsibility of providing this great night for all the seniors. If you have a senior student, come to this meeting and find out how you can get involved.

AFTER SCHOOL TUTORING AND HOMEWORK HELP

One of the things that our 21st Century grant funding allows us to do is run an after school tutoring / homework help program. We have budgeted this year to run it four nights a week: Monday—Thursday. After school tutoring will run from 3:40 until 5:40. The buses will leave the school at 5:45 PM.

Any student who is in an after-school activity may ride the activity bus. Students who are staying for after-school tutoring and who are riding the bus are expected to stay in the classroom the entire time. Students who are walking, being picked up, or driving themselves may leave when they are finished working. Students may not leave the campus and return later. Students are given a 15 minute break and a sack "dinner" about 4:30. There is no cost for this meal. No student will be allowed to ride the activity bus if they are not in an after school program or a sport.

Students are required to sign in and out. If you are assuming your child is coming to after-school, you may call the school the following day to check on attendance. Many students could benefit from this extra help, so encourage your students to attend if they need the help.

The computer lab is open every night between 3:30 and 4:30 for student use.

Help with Health Insurance



Siskiyou Community Health Center's school based health centers (at Evergreen, LBMS, and IVHS) now have applications on hand to help families apply for health insurance for their children. Many children who would not qualify for Oregon Health Plan previously because their family income was a little above the threshold may now be able to qualify for free or very low cost health insurance through the state-provided "Healthy Kids" program. A family of 4 making as much as \$66,000/year may now be able to qualify for this insurance.

From the Counseling Dept. at IVHS:

A To Do List for Seniors and their Parents:

1. Take the SAT. It is recommended that juniors take the SAT in the spring, and take it again as seniors in the fall. The web site to register for the SAT is: <u>www.collegeboard.com</u> Our school code is 380150 (you will need this number). You may qualify for a fee waiver (inquire in counseling). SAT's are given here on Jan. 22 & May 7th. They can also be taken at various dates at Grants Pass High School. Dates to register for the SAT's and the **deadline dates** are posted in counseling.

2. Get letters of recommendation. Get a head start on the process. For our scholarship packet you will need two letters; one of the letters must be from an employer, community member, or friend of the family (not from a teacher/staff from the school).

3. Get a P.I.N. to apply for FAFSA. Go online at: <u>www.pin.ed.gov</u>. to apply for a P.I.N. The parent and the student need to apply separately for a P.I.N.

4. Come to our Financial Aid/Scholarship Information Night

Tentatively set for Dec. 2nd @ 6:30 p.m. Get information on how to apply for federal financial aid, and receive our local scholarship packet. Also available: Oregon Students Assistance Commission Scholarships (OSAC), go online at www.getcollegefunds.org and fill out the application, print it, and send.

5. Work on your activities chart: available at www.getcollegefunds

6. Begin writing your typed responses to the following (max. 150 words each): Explain your career aspirations and your educational plan to meet these goals.

- Describe a challenge or obstacle you've faced in the last ten years. What did you learn about yourself from this experience?
- Describe a personal accomplishment and the strengths and skills you used to achieve it.
- Explain how you have helped your family or made your community a better place to live.
 Please provide specific examples.

7. In January you need to file your FAFSA. Once you have your P.I.N. you can go online and submit your FAFSA. Attend our FAFSA/College Prep workshops (dates to be announced).

8. Apply to College or trade school. Admission application dates are as early as Nov. 1st! Make sure you visit the web page of the school that you are interested in attending to get application deadline dates.


