What is the mission of the non-profit/community organization? *

The preservation of a 100+ year old building serving the residents of Dayton Community in south Sebastian County, Arkansas.

What service(s) does the non-profit/community organization provide? *

Originally built as a schoolhouse in the early 1900's, this historical building was used for community gatherings, elections, and 4-H Club meetings, just to name a few. It is currently used in much the same way as the Dayton 4-H club holds it's monthly here, the local home schooler co-op uses it for music education and the building is available for rent to the public for parties, weddings, etc. All income from rentals go toward the care and maintenance of the building.

Describe the kinds of volunteer tasks students will perform.

Fundraisers are held throughout the year which requires the need for volunteers. We have an annual dinner and bluegrass music event which requires volunteers to serve food and bus tables. We hold a Holiday Bazaar for which we use volunteers to work the food concession.
