**Please state your proposal briefly and clearly. What do you want the board to know, discuss, or decide?**

The Board's approval is requested in submitting a federal grant for approximately \$600,000 under the Innovative Approaches to Literacy program through the US Department of Education. The grant has 3 basic goals: 1. Transform TRSD school libraries to become up-to-date, technology rich, interactive spaces with a research-based program model; 2. Increase outreach and community partnerships to support literacy for all, including early childhood literacy activities, and increasing family involvement; and 3. Use library transformation as a strategy for increasing academic achievement and improving literacy for all through programming and professional development in technology integration, information resources, and digital literacy.

**Provide history/background information on your proposal:**

A year ago, the TRSD Board affirmed its commitment to rebuilding and transforming the library program by hiring a full-time district librarian. Recently, the TRSD budget for the library was increased to support this process. This proposal is a means to accelerate the transformation process and provide a foundation for future planning, growth, and implementation.
