Teaching, Learning & Relevance

- February CTE Month - February was Career & Technical Education Month and THS celebrated career paths in a variety of ways. One highlight was the many guest speakers that presented to students during Resource Hour. We want to thank all of them for their time and expertise. It was a great experience for our students to speak directly with industry professionals regarding the career field, education requirements and what their Academic and Career Plans should account for in preparation.
- US History students took part in a writing contest sponsored by the Tomahawk Historical Society in memory of Darlene Wurl. The contest began with a tour of the Tomahawk Historical Society Museum and concluded with an essay contest where students described an event, person, or part of Tomahawk's history. Winners were announced at a brief ceremony and the top 3 essays were awarded cash prizes donated by the Bishop family. Both the social studies department and Tomahawk Historical Society have agreed to work together to make this an annual field trip & writing contest for US History students.
- The ELA 11th and 12th grade classes had presentations from published authors Steve and Laurie Mitchell. They worked with students on the process of writing science fiction stories that included character and plot development, research, and author's craft.
- The Choir performed the annual Pops Concert. The students selected pieces by various artists that they enjoy performing for the audience. The concert was upbeat and entertaining. Thanks for the great night of music and fun.
- Anatomy and Medical Terminology Classes traveled to Nicolet for the "Live from the Heart" presentation. Students were able to observe a surgical procedure and learn about the professions involved. They also were able to reflect on Academic & Career Planning processes that help to prepare for a career in Health Sciences.

- FBLA and THS Incorporated students participated in the Wisconsin State Lifeskills competition at Edgewood College for the third time in the past four years. LifeSkills is a free, interactive consumer education program and competition. The team finished just shy of advancing to the state championship, but played extremely well against tough competition.
- Career & Technical Education students participated in the annual Nicolet Competition Day. Academic competitions were conducted by Nicolet instructors and business representatives in a variety of areas including welding, fabrication, robotics, website design, criminal justice, culinary, early childhood education, health occupations, art, and cosmetology to name a few. - The ACT Test was administered for the first time using an online format. Extensive training, technology testing, and planning were a part of preparing for this new format. Overall, things ran smoothly.
