Central High School Update

Duluth Public Schools received notice that Saturday Properties' will not move forward with its purchase agreement for the Central High School property.

The district is still planning on moving forward with the demolition of the Central High School building this year and continues to work with the City of Duluth on its services center and transportation facilities. We are also continuing to market the additional property for sale.

The district closed on the sale of Historic Old Central with Saturday Properties in February and is not affected by the termination of the Central High School purchase agreement.

Masking Criteria Update

On March, 7th, we enacted the new CDC guidance on masking. St. Louis County continues to have a low transmission rate and we are continuing without requiring masks for the foreseeable future, as forecasts do not indicate that there will be a need for practice change.

Our rates of spread within our schools have remained very low, even after this change.
