Exhibit - Behavioral Guidelines - 20243-20254

The Board of Education identifies the following offenses as unacceptable student behavior and requiring corrective action for each. However, disciplinary offenses are not limited to those listed below when, in the judgment of the administration or the dean, such offenses disrupt the school climate, or constitute gross disobedience or misconduct as determined by the Board of Education or the administration. Corrective actions provide for progressive discipline for the chronic abuser of the same rule or for varying degrees of severity of the particular offense. School rules apply to and from school.

The listed disciplinary measures are a range of options that will not always be applicable in every case. In some circumstances, it may not be possible to avoid suspending or expelling a student because behavioral interventions, other than a suspension and expulsion, will not be appropriate and available, and the only reasonable and practical way to resolve the threat and/or address the disruption is a suspension or expulsion. In other cases where a suspension or expulsion may otherwise be the typical consequence, mitigating circumstances may warrant non-exclusionary interventions.

Behavior that interrupts the learning environment, but does not stop the learning process or compromise the safety of the school, may be addressed by staff in the classroom or the hallway without Dean intervention.considered mischievous. Teachers and staff will follow the Classroom Management Plans for mischievous behaviorset and maintain classroom expectations to address classroom disruptions. Severe misbehaviors include, but are not limited to: acts of violence, weapons, overt defiance, substance abuse, vandalism and other behavior that prevents the safe functioning of the school. Students will be referred immediately to the dean for severe behavior.

Corporal punishment is prohibited. Corporal punishment is defined as slapping, paddling, or prolonged maintenance of students in physically painful positions, or intentional infliction of bodily harm. District 204 does not permit corporal punishment. However, faculty and staff may use reasonable force as needed to protect property, others or themselves and to remove a student from the classroom or other areas for disruptive behavior.

The Offenses listed below are defined for purposes of notice to parents and students. The Action column sets forth the typical range of interventions and/or consequences for violations. However, the District assesses each violation independently taking into account context and circumstances and reserves the right to impose appropriate interventions and/or consequences that may fall outside the Action ranges set forth below.

Harassment, Intimidation or Bullying

Harassment, intimidation, or bullying means any intentional statement, by written message, video, or image—including those that are electronically transmitted through text message, social media, or other forms of electronic communication—verbal, or physical act, including but not limited to one shown to be motivated by race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, gender, sexual orientation; (—including gender expression or identity), physical appearance, socioeconomic status, academic status, pregnancy, parenting status, homelessness, age, marital status, mental or physical disability or other distinguishing characteristics, association with a person or group with one or more of the aforementioned actual or perceived characteristics, or any other distinguishing characteristics when an act:

- Physically harms a student or damages the student's property or
- Has the effect of substantially interfering with a student's education or
- Is so severe, persistent or pervasive that it creates an intimidating or threatening educational environment or
- Has the effect of substantially disrupting the orderly operation of the school.

Bullying – Repeated, persistent and aggressive behavior intended to cause fear, distress, or harm to another person's body, emotions, self-esteem or reputation, and a power imbalance.

Hazing/Initiation

Administering physical punishment to an individual, directing verbal abuse at an individual, or requiring an individual to perform an immoral act as requirement to gaining membership into any club or organization.

Sexual violence occurs when a reasonable person knew or should have known that the victim did not or could not engage in the sex act voluntarily. Threat of Student Violence

Student violence and/or tThreats of student violence on District 204 campuses or at any District 204 sponsored activities will not be tolerated. Additionally, violence or threats of violence against any student, school official or employee will not be allowed anytime. Students are strictly prohibited from engaging in conduct which creates circumstances which may cause disruption at school, or at school sponsored activities. Making an explicit threat on an Internet website against a school employee, a student, or any school-related personnel if the Internet website through which the threat was made is a site that was accessible within the school at the time the threat was made or was available to third parties who worked or studied within the school grounds at the time the threat was made, and the threat could be reasonably interpreted as threatening to the safety and security of the threatened individual because of his or her duties or employment status or status as a student inside the school is considered a Threat of Violence. Types of conduct which are in violation of this policy include, but are not limited to, those described below:

- Any acts of physical violence other than what is deemed reasonable by school officials for self-defense, and protection of other persons or property;
- Placing others in danger of imminent physical harm;
- Threatening, planning, or conspiring with others to engage in violent acts; and
- Joking about engaging in violent acts against others, or otherwise making any threats, or intimidating remarks.

Substance Abuse

Use of, possession of, or being under the influence of alcohol at school or school-sponsored event, influence of alcohol or any controlled substance represented to be a drug, or any substance which, if inhaled, ingested, or otherwise introduced into the body, is capable of causing intoxication, hallucination, or excitement or dulling of brain or central nervous system functions and the student's behavior would lead a reasonable person to conclude that the student intended for the substance to be used by the student or others to cause intoxication, hallucination, or excitement or dulling of brain or central nervous system functions, or possession of drug paraphernalia at school or at school-sponsored activities. Violation of Electronic Networks - Authorization for

This Authorization does not attempt to state all required or proscribed behavior by users. However, some specific examples are provided. The failure of any user to follow the terms of the Authorization for Electronic Network Access will result in the loss of privileges, disciplinary action, and/or appropriate legal action. 36 The district provides notification to students, parents/guardians that it may not request or require a student to provide a password or other related account information in order to gain access to the students' account or profile on a social networking website if the district has reasonable cause to believe that the student's account on a social networking website contains evidence that the student has violated a disciplinary rule or policy. (School Board Policy 7:140, 7:190)

Weapon

A student who is determined to have brought one of the following objects to school, any school sponsored activity or event, or any activity or event that bears a reasonable relationship to school shall be expelled for a period of at least one calendar year but not more than 2 calendar years: 1. A firearm, meaning any gun rifle, shotgun, or weapon as defined by section 921 of Title 18 of the United States Code (18U.S.C.&921), firearm as defined in section 1.1 of the Firearm Owners Identification Card Act (430 ILCS65/), or firearm as defined is Section 24-1 of the Criminal Code of 1961 (720 ILCS 5/24-1).

2. A knife, brass knuckles, or other knuckle weapon

SUSPENSION PROCEDURES

In-School Suspension

The Superintendent or designee is authorized to maintain an in-school suspension program. The program shall include, at a minimum, each of the following:

- Before assigning a student to in-school suspension, parents will be notified if possible, the charges will be explained and the student will be given an opportunity to respond to the charges.
- 2. Students are supervised by licensed school personnel.
- Students are given the opportunity to complete classroom work during the in-school suspension for equivalent academic credit.

Out-of-School Suspension

The Superintendent or designee shall implement suspension procedures that provide, at a minimum, for each of the following:

- A conference during which the charges will be explained and the student will be given an opportunity to respond to the charges before he or she may be suspended.
- A pre-suspension conference is not required, and the student can be immediately suspended when the student's presence poses a continuing danger to persons or property or an ongoing threat of disruption to the educational process. In such cases, the notice and conference shall follow as soon as practicable.
- 3. An attempted phone call to the student's parent(s)/guardian(s).
- 4. A written notice of the suspension to the parent(s)/guardian(s) and the student, which shall:
 - a. Provide notice to the parent(s)/guardian(s) of their child's right to a review of the suspension;
 - Include information about an opportunity to make up work missed during the suspension for equivalent academic credit;
 - c. Detail the specific act of gross disobedience or misconduct resulting in the decision to suspend;
 - d. Provide rationale or an explanation of how the chosen number of suspension days will address the threat or disruption posed by the student or his or her act of gross disobedience or misconduct; and
 - e. Depending upon the length of the out-of-school suspension, include the following applicable information:
 - For a suspension of 3 school days or less, an explanation that the student's continuing presence in school would either pose:
 - a) A threat to school safety, or
 - b) A disruption to other students' learning opportunities.
 - ii. For a suspension of 4 or more school days, an explanation:
 - a) That other appropriate and available behavioral and disciplinary interventions have been exhausted,
 - b) As to whether school officials attempted other interventions or determined that no other interventions were available for the student, and
 - c) That the student's continuing presence in school would either:
 - i) Pose a threat to the safety of other students, staff, or members of the school community, or
 - ii) Substantially disrupt, impede, or interfere with the operation of the school.
 - iii. For a suspension of 5 or more school days, the information listed in section 4.e.ii., above, along with documentation by the Superintendent or designee determining what, if any, appropriate and available support services will be provided to the student during the length of his or her suspension.
- 5. A summary of the notice, including the reason for the suspension and the suspension length, must be given to the Board by the Superintendent or designee.
- 6. Upon request of the parent(s)/guardian(s), a review of the suspension shall be conducted by the Board or a hearing officer appointed by the Board. At the review, the student's parent(s)/guardian(s) may appear and discuss the

suspension with the Board or its hearing officer and may be represented by counsel. Whenever there is evidence that mental illness may be the cause for the suspension, the Superintendent or designee shall invite a representative from the Department of Human Services to consult with the Board. After presentation of the evidence or receipt of the hearing officer's report, the Board shall take such action as it finds appropriate. If the suspension is upheld, the Board's written suspension decision shall specifically detail items (a) and (e) in number 4, above.

Expulsions:

The Superintendent or designee shall implement expulsion procedures that provide, at a minimum, for the following:

- Before a student may be expelled, the student and his or her parent(s)/guardian(s) shall be provided a written request
 to appear at a hearing to determine whether the student should be expelled. The request shall be sent by registered or
 certified mail, return receipt requested. The request shall:
 - a. Include the time, date, and place for the hearing.
 - b. Briefly describe what will happen during the hearing.
 - c. Detail the specific act of gross disobedience or misconduct resulting in the decision to recommend expulsion.
 - d. List the student's prior suspension(s).
 - e. State that the School Code allows the School Board to expel a student for a definite period of time not to exceed 2 calendar years, as determined on a case-by-case basis.
 - f. Ask that the student or parent(s)/guardian(s) or attorney inform the Superintendent or Board Attorney if the student will be represented by an attorney and, if so, the attorney's name and contact information.
- 2. Unless the student and parent(s)/guardian(s) indicate that they do not want a hearing or fail to appear at the designated time and place, the hearing will proceed. It shall be conducted by a hearing officer appointed by the Board of Education. The hearing officer shall report to the Board the evidence presented at the hearing and the Board shall take such final action as it finds appropriate. Whenever there is evidence that mental illness may be the cause for the recommended expulsion, the Superintendent or designee shall invite a representative from a local mental health agency to consult with the Board.
- 3. During the expulsion hearing, the Board or hearing officer shall hear evidence concerning whether the student is guilty of the gross disobedience or misconduct as charged. School officials must provide: (1) testimony of any other interventions attempted and exhausted or of their determination that no other appropriate and available interventions were available for the student, and (2) evidence of the threat or disruption posed by the student. The student and his or her parent(s)/guardian(s) may be represented by counsel, offer evidence, present witnesses, cross-examine witnesses who testified, and otherwise present reasons why the student should not be expelled. After presentation of the evidence or receipt of the hearing officer's report, the Board shall decide the issue of guilt and take such action as it finds appropriate.
- 4. If the Board acts to expel the student, its written expulsion decision shall:
 - Detail the specific reason why removing the student from his or her learning environment is in the best interest
 of the school.
 - b. Provide a rationale for the specific duration of the recommended expulsion.
 - c. Document how school officials determined that all behavioral and disciplinary interventions have been exhausted by specifying which interventions were attempted or whether school officials determined that no other appropriate and available interventions existed for the student.
 - d. Document how the student's continuing presence in school would (1) pose a threat to the safety of other students, staff, or members of the school community, or (2) substantially disrupt, impede, or interfere with the operation of the school.
- 5. Upon expulsion, the District may refer the student to appropriate and available support services.
