The meeting was in person and offered virtually.

## 1. Opening and Call to Order Board Chair

Chair Gregg welcomed everyone and called the work session to order at 7:58 a.m.

## 1.1. Pledge of Allegiance

The group stood and recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

## 1.2. Meeting Audio Recorded

Director Harrison stated that this meeting is being audio recorded.

## 2. Tier III Behavior Update Kevin Headings

Kevin Headings presented a progressive discipline plan for student behavior that is comprised of three tiers. Pendleton School District's priority is to take a proactive and preventative approach using the three tiers of strategies district-wide. He reviewed the current tier III and the long-range plan possibilities and ideas they are exploring.

## 3. Staffing Update Kevin Dinning

At the request of the board, Mr. Dinning prepared a staffing update. Fourteen certified positions have been added since 2019-20, and two elementary assistant principals in 2021-22 amid a declining enrollment of approximately 200 students over the past five years. Title I funds are focused at the PELC, which pays half of the paraprofessionals. The administration and licensed staff additions all target student support, including behavior, academic achievement, and skills gaps.

## 4. IMPACT Teams Matt Yoshioka

Impact Teams is another phrase used to describe and is one step beyond Professional Learning Communities (PLCs). Mr. Yoshioka explained collective teacher efficacy and why, as well as what self-empowered learners are and why. The Pendleton School District has contracted with consultants from a group called The Core Collaborative to guide some of our PLC teams through the process of becoming an "IMPACT Team." They meet four times a year to set goals, review prior assignments, and make plans for the next meeting. PSD Teams in year one are the Washington

Elementary Grades 3-5 teachers. PSD Teams in year 2 are PHS Science & Language Arts Teachers and SMS Science & Language Arts Teachers.

The plan requirements include a variety of topics, including but not limited to, plan for health care space, communicable disease prevention, communication strategies, health screenings, and hearing, vision and dental screenings.

## 5.5. EBC – Emergency Plan and First Aid

(New) – Delete current policy EBC/EBCA Emergency Procedures and Disaster Plans and replace with OSBA recommended policy. House Bill 3584 was passed in the 2023 legislative session. The bill requires districts to adopt policy language about using electronic communication to notify parents, guardians and employees within 24 hours of a safety threat action that was not a drill. The bill states the communication should be "provided in a manner that communicates relevant facts and details as necessary and useful."

Delete current policy and AR. Replace with OSBA recommended policy. Guidance on exclusion of students found with head lice has changed in recent years. There is now a consensus from other agencies, i.e., National Association of School Nurses, Center for Disease Control and Prevention, Oregon School Nurses Association, which recommends against excluding students with head lice or nits from the classroom. Additionally, a rule, originally found in an Oregon Health Authority rule (OAR 333-019-0010), which allowed schools to create exclusionary practices for head lice, has since been repealed.

House Bill 2281, effective January 1, 2024, requires a district school board to designate one or more civil rights coordinators for the district.

With the passage of Senate Bill 283, the law was revised regarding superintendent contracts to remove mention of laws relevant to education service district boards added by Senate Bill 1521 in 2022 to ORS 332.505.

- 12.3. 2025-27 PERS Rates Michelle Jones

In even years, school districts receive updated PERS employer rates for the upcoming biennium. There are substantial increases moving forward. For Pendleton School District, the 2023-2025 rates are 2.83 %, increasing to 13.82% for Tier One/Two and 0%, increasing to 10.64% for OPSRP for the 2025-2027 rates. This equates to over \$2 million in increased payroll expenditures for the 2025-26 school year. Three groups will be in negotiations this year, and the trickle-down effect is not known at this time. Mrs. Jones reminded the board the ESSER funds are going away. She will be attending the OASBO conference in November, with a focus on PERS and PERS bonds. Rates are set and cannot change. She will be keeping the board appraised as information becomes available.

Chair Gregg brought in a letter from Director Dale Freeman submitting his resignation from the board as of September 30, 2024. He expressed his appreciation for Dale's service on the board for the past nine years. The resignation was accepted, and a vacancy was declared as of October 8, 2024.

Director Eagleheart expressed Dale's time and commitment to the board, saying he will be missed.
