Kindergarten

In math this month we will be learning about one more and one less which will lead into composing and decomposing numbers. We will end the month with addition. In social studies we will be learning the difference between a want and a need and then move onto community helpers. In science we will focus our learning on living and nonliving. Finally in ELAR we will learn how to use descriptive words and our emotions to create stories. We will also be learning about elaborative detail and how adding these details enhance our stories.

First Grade

This month, in reading, we will be studying all the elements of fables and fairy tales. We will also be learning some new things about poetry. In writing, we will get the chance to create our very own fairy tales and poetry. In math, we will continue learning skip counting from before the break. In science and social studies, we will be studying landforms and their physical characteristics.

Second Grade

Our second grade students will be focusing on two-digit subtraction in math with and without regrouping, and three digit addition and subtraction. Our little scientists will be investigating Earth Science by discovering natural and man-made resources, rocks and minerals, and where we can find water on earth. During English Language Arts our students will become young poets, learning how to apply rhymes, imagery, and rhythm as they study poetry.

Computer

This month second grade will be starting to work on their Google slide shows. First grade will work on language and math skills. Kindergarten will be working on hand-eye coordination which increases their mouse skills and also sight word and counting skills.

Music

January will kick off the beginning of musical practice for the First graders. Kindergarten will begin to play more complex instruments. They will continue singing and learning about the foundations of music. Second grade will start an in-depth study on instruments. They will begin learning and performing various rhythm notations. All of the students will sing, dance, and move to the music. Kindergarten and Second grade will learn about Beethoven and study his music.

PE

In PE we will be working on individual and team games. Students will be practicing skills and learning basic rules for soccer, basketball, football, etc.

First and second grade students participate in Accelerated Reader for powerful reading practice that measures the quantity of reading and quality of reading comprehension. Teachers have incentives in place in the classroom to encourage students to meet six-week goals. The library sends digital reading badges in Google drive to students who

increase their reading word count. Students who meet certain criteria can "level up" their reading with certification badges, certificates, and small prizes.
