RELATION TO ESSENTIAL KNOWLEDGE AND SKILLS	The District shall establish instructional objectives that relate to the essen- tial knowledge and skills for grade-level subjects or courses. These ob- jectives shall address the skills needed for successful performance in the next grade or next course in a sequence of courses.
	Assignments, tests, projects, classroom activities, and other instructional activities shall be designed so that the student's performance indicates the level of mastery of the designated District objectives. The student's mastery level shall be a major factor in determining the grade for a subject or course.
GUIDELINES FOR GRADING	The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that each campus or instruc- tional level develops guidelines for teachers to follow in determining grades for students. These guidelines shall ensure that grading reflects <u>a</u> student's <u>relative mastery of an assignment</u> achievement and that a suf- ficient number of grades are taken to support the <u>grade</u> average <del>grade</del> assigned. Guidelines for grading shall be clearly communicated to stu- dents and parents.
	In accordance with grading guidelines, a student shall be permit- ted a reasonable opportunity to redo an assignment or retake a test for which the student received a failing grade.
GRANTING OF CREDIT	The District shall offer a student the following options to receive course credit for graduation, if all other conditions are satisfied:
	1. Passing a one-semester course
	2. Two-semester average of a full-year course is greater than or equal to a grade of 70
	3. Credit by examination
	4. Passing an approved correspondence course

CONFERENCE	A conference shall be scheduled at the request of a teacher or a parent anytime during the school year.

RECORDING FAILING GRADES	Teachers shall record a grade of no lower than 65 in the permanent record for the first nine weeks of school. Teachers shall record the actual grade earned in each student's permanent record for each succeeding grading period.
GRADING SYSTEM	The grading system in District schools shall be based on alpha letters for prekindergarten and kindergarten, and numeric symbols for grades 1–12 with exceptions noted in ELEMENTARY, below. All student records, report cards, and permanent grade labels shall reflect alpha characters for prekindergarten and kindergarten and numeric characters for grades 1–12.
PREKINDERGARTEN AND KINDERGARTEN	Grading designations of "Excellent" (E), "Satisfactory" (S), "Needs Improvement" (N), and "Unsatisfactory" (U) shall be used in all areas for reporting purposes to parents at the prekindergarten and kindergarten levels.
ELEMENTARY	In elementary grades 1–6, achievement in fine arts, health, and physical education shall be reported to parents as follows: "Excellent" (E), "Satisfactory" (S), "Needs Improvement" (N), or "Unsatisfactory" (U).
