were nice enough to come and read to our class during our pajama party which was a reward for finishing out narrative writing stories. Ms.Jeckell's class.


Garden Club





Both grade levels have continued with PDSA's to focus instruction in the lowest subskill and have chosen students who show most need.

The Reading committee is currently presenting new reading programs to staff and teachers are rating them according to a rubric. Two reading blocks have implemented a Reader's workshop style approach during walk to read using SFA materials for Wings instruction. Both grade levels are utilizing the Writing binder by filling out the course organizers and writing papers that reflect the genre through Writer's workshop.
