Girls Soccer

Girls Soccer has three games remaining in district play and has already secured a playoff berth. Hallsville will represent our district as the **#1 large school seed**, with our likely bi-district opponent being McKinney North Bulldogs.

We are currently working to secure a neutral site for the bi-district playoff game and will share that information once it is finalized.

The race for the **#2 and #3 seeds** in the district will likely come down to the final game of the season.

This season also marks an impressive milestone for our program, as **Girls Soccer will have made the playoffs 10 out of the last 11 years**. The team currently holds a **10–3–1 record in district play**.

Softball

Softball, much like Baseball, is off to a **strong start** this season. The Ladycats traveled to the Dallas area during tournament play, facing top-tier opponents that have prepared them well for the challenges ahead. These competitive trips have been key in keeping the Ladycats **primed for a playoff run**.

As district play begins, the Ladycats aim to **repeat as district champions**, facing stiff competition from programs such as Lufkin Panthers and Whitehouse Wildcats.

Baseball

Baseball is currently **10–3–1** on the young season and will open district play tonight against Texas High Tigers.

The Bobcats are coming off an impressive tournament stretch that matched them up against some of the top opponents from around the state. The team has benefited from a strong preseason schedule that has helped prepare them for district competition. Expectations for the Bobcats are to compete for a district championship alongside strong programs such as Whitehouse Wildcats, Lufkin Panthers, and Mount Pleasant Tigers.

Powerlifting

Powerlifting is entering the final phase of its season. For the **second year in a row**, Coach Green has helped several young ladies and young men qualify for the state meets.

The girls will travel to Edinburg over Spring Break to compete in the state meet, while the boys will compete in Abilene.

The Ladycat powerlifters also had an outstanding performance at the regional meet in Royse City, finishing **2nd place as a team**.

Having been around Hallsville since the early years of girls powerlifting, I am confident this marks **the first time a Hallsville girls powerlifting team has placed at either a regional or state meet**, making it a significant milestone for the program.

Track

Track is in the **middle of its young season**, and the Junior High girls teams made a strong impression at the Hallsville Jr. High Invitational, **winning both of their divisions by over 75 points**.

Before Spring Break, Hallsville will host the annual **Tommy Miller Relays**, honoring a great coach and mentor during our Thursday meet. Following our two invitationals, we will also host the **District Championships at Bobcat Stadium**. Hosting successful meets requires a strong staff, and our track team staff does a **tremendous job**, earning the confidence and respect of area schools.

At the high school level, the Ladycat Track teams are also performing well, including **two 2nd-place finishes at Longview and Texas High**, despite the majority of their girls still participating in other sports.
