Dr. Jeannie Meza-Chavez stated the attendance boundary changes have been visited before. Unfortunately, declining enrollment has an impact on campus enrollment.

Ms. Alexis Tellez stated she would like guidance on how the attendance boundary works to understand how students are assigned to campuses.

Ms. Elizabeth Perez presented the finance part of the presentation.

Dr. Jeannie Meza-Chavez asked the board to ask questions and discuss district sustainability.

Mr. Lorenzo Luevano stated we should provide campus information to the community. The numbers will help the community understand the future sustainability of the district. Planning efficiently and disseminating the information will help the board and the community make the decision in a timely manner.

Mr. Eduardo Chavez stated TRE and/or Bond preparations need to be started. A decision needs to be made, but it shouldn't be made based on numbers or data; conversations need to be had with the community and employees.

Mr. Lorenzo Luevano stated he agrees with not making the decision solely on data but thinks it's a good starting point on bringing awareness to the community.

Mr. Eduardo Chavez stated the TRE and/or Bond preparations will need to start as to make it for the May 2027 election instead of the November 2026 election.

Dr. Jeannie Meza-Chavez stated the timelines presented for TRE and/or Bond preparations are just for information. The timeline can be revised and its contingent on the

facility assessment and long-range facility plan.

Ms. Alexis Tellez stated that election dates must be chosen correctly so that there is a good voter turnout.

Dr. Jeannie Meza-Chavez asked district leaders to help gather questions from the community/employees and to provide factual information.
