As you are probably aware, Keller ISD is experiencing an unprecedented level of growth. During this school year alone, the district has grown by more than 2,000 new students, and more arrive each day. And with thousands of home sites under development, we expect this trend to continue for the next decade.

In March of this year, voters approved a measure that called for building a new intermediate and middle school, along with two new elementary campuses. These facilities are set to open for the 2006-07 school year, and construction is underway. While the addition of four new campuses is exciting, the opening of these schools will impact thousands of students across the district. In an effort to relieve overcrowding at our other campuses, Keller ISD will once again be looking at making some changes to the district's attendance zones.
