





Did you know enrollment for next school year is now open through your MyPACE account? For this month's Teacher Tip, let's turn our attention to planning next year's curriculum.

First, I would suggest you take a look at what you are currently using. Is it working for you and your student(s)? Do you feel successful and does it meet your needs? It could very well be that you continue using it for next year. The nice thing about that choice is that you and your student(s) are already familiar with the layout and progression, so you can just keep going.


Perhaps, now that you are familiar with your curriculum, you would like to enhance it with supplemental materials. Homeschool community groups and social media connections can be a great resource for learning what other parents in your situation recommend. Teachers Pay Teachers is an excellent resource for finding supplemental curriculum, as is Outschool.

However, if your current curriculum is not something you would like to continue with next year, for whatever reason, let's take a look at some options.

For those of you currently using online curriculum, paper-based curriculum provides some ease because you have all the material right in your hands. There are no passwords to remember. No tests to unlock. You do need to provide the instruction and grade your student(s) work yourself, though most curriculum provides you with answer keys.

For those of you currently using paper-based curriculum, online courses relieve you of the responsibility of direct instruction and grading assignments, but you do need to make sure your student remains on task and is making progress through the course. Online courses can provide a broader range of topics, so you can select courses that suit your student(s) interests and can, depending on the course, be counted for college credit.
